You will write a five paragraph essay based on one of the nonfiction books you read. Your essay will be graded according to the attached AP Language Rubric and will be due, PRINTED, on the first day of school. Set up your paper according to MLA guidelines (heading in top left corner, unique title, double spaced 12 point font etc.) Do not arrive asking to print in the computer lab- part of your assignment and your success in this class requires planning ahead.

PROMPT:

Works of nonfiction, whether implicitly or explicitly, present an argument to the reader and support this argument with different types of evidence and rhetorical techniques. Select one work you read and identify the work's central argument. Then analyze the evidence and techniques the author uses to support his or her argument. Finally, in the conclusion, evaluate the argument as a whole. Avoid summary and focus on analyzing and evaluating evidence.

<u>South Plainfield High School Summer Reading List 2022</u> <u>AP English-Literature and Composition-Grade 12</u>

The AP Literature and Composition course requires extensive independent reading and writing, and is designed for the hardworking student who enjoys both of the aforementioned activities. There will be a test during the first week of school, a project, and an essay associated with these books.

READ <u>ALL</u> OF THE FOLLOWING BOOKS BY THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:

In addition to reading <u>all</u> of these texts, AP English Literature students must also complete an MLA-style essay on the topic that is listed below. You must have it submitted to our Google Classroom page in the Classwork stream by the beginning of class on the first day of school, as well as submitting the essay to *Turnitin.com*. Ten points will be deducted for every day that it is late. The first draft of the essay is worth a test grade. You will get it back during the first marking period to revise.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR WRITING THE ESSAY (1 Test and 1 Quiz Grade for the Revision)

- 1. ESSAY TOPIC -- Write a 3-5-page essay on one of the above listed summer reading books that focuses on the following topic: What universal truths does your chosen work communicate and how can the work be related to real-world issues? Use several quotes from the novel, quotes from reliable news/history sources, AND personal observations in your essay.
- 2. MINIMUM 3 SOURCES -- Use MLA style when writing the essay. MLA style includes **parenthetical citations** and a **works cited page**. Search online for guides to using MLA style, as there are hundreds of them. In addition to the novel/play, you should have at least 2 other sources that support your contentions.
- 3. Your essay should include **several direct quotes from the novel** (NOT from something that someone else has written about the novel) to support your points. These quotes should be properly introduced, and the connection of each to the points you are trying to support should be clear.

- 5. Additional Requirements -- Size 12 text, clear font, double space, begin with title after heading/header, formal/grammatically correct writing. One exception -- You must use the word / when making personal connections.
