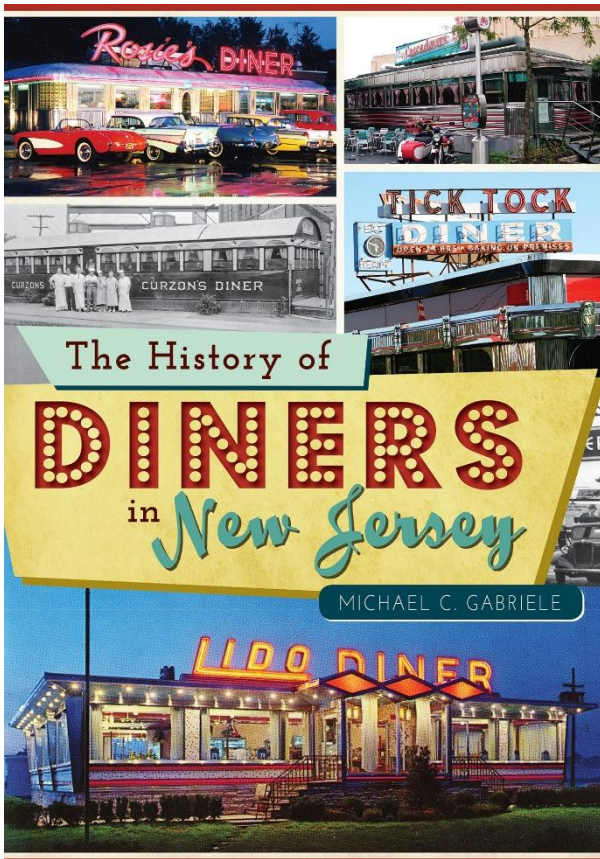


History of Diners in New Jersey
