

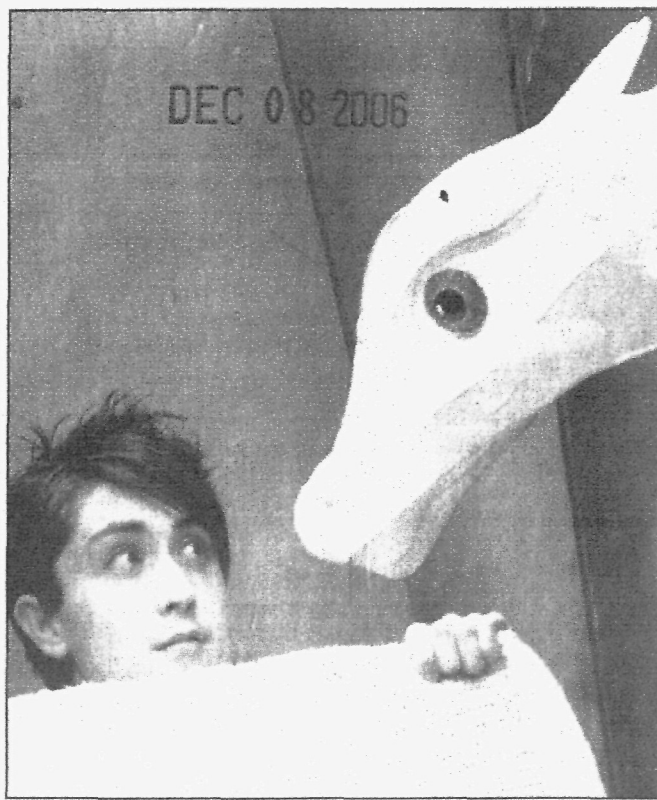

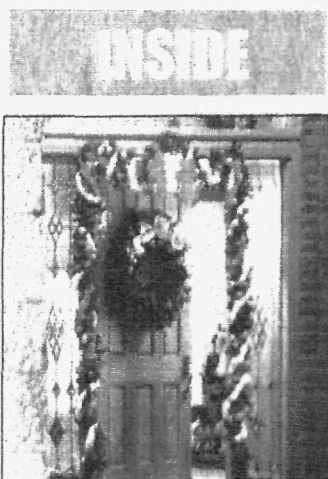

## County getting word out on secondhand smoking

When John Horensky coached youth sports, he found it ironic that while he had kids on the field, learning good exercise habits, developing self-confidence, and improving their health, some of their parents were 10 yards away, smoking. "You could smell it on the field," the Somerset County health officer said. "It's really unbelievable. They'd take their child home, and smoke in the car."

To combat that kind of practice, the Somerset County Cancer Coalition is giving away signs saying "Please Refrain from Smoking. Lungs at Work," to municipalities to post near places where children congregate at parks, such as playgrounds.

The signs are part of the county's efforts during November, which has been designated National Lung

Cancer Awareness Month. Members of the coalition, as well as members of other organizations and county officials, announced the effort on Tuesday, during a press conference about lung cancer awareness.

So far, three towns — Bernards, Montgomery, and Branchburg — have asked for the signs. While smoking has not been banned at parks, the

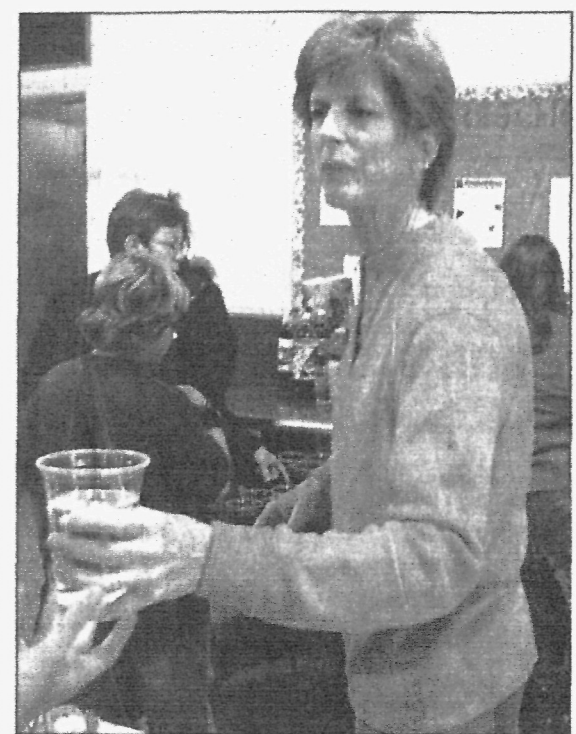
signs are a recommendation and reminder about the effects of secondhand smoke, as well as an encouragement to be a positive role model and reduce litter.

Lung cancer awareness isn't just about smoking cessation, although that is a part of the effort.

Dr. Kathleen Toomey, an oncologist with Somerset Medical Center, said that the survival rate for patients diagnosed with lung cancer is and continues to be low. The disease kills more people than breast cancer and prostate cancer, but there is less funding for lung cancer research.

"Breast cancer research is done on thousands of patients. Lung cancer research is done on only hundreds of patients," she said. "We have to stop blaming the smokers and start seeing lung cancer as a disease."

## Annual train show is chugging along

**WOODBIDGE** — In the tradition of family exhibitions for the holiday season the Barron Arts Center will once again host an exhibition of model trains curated by Michael Gelesky. This year's layout, "The Trains Are Back on Track," will feature four O gauge trains running on independent loops.

The exhibition continues through Dec. 23 from 11 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday through Friday and 2-4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The display of over 300 feet of track will feature a moving operating playground and three towns including Main Street U.S.A., a small town in the snowy mountains and an expanded Hershey Park with Hershey Kisses streetlamps and an operating paratrooper ride. Survivor Francine Pesece Noce said that early detection is the key to her survival. She had gone to the doctor for something unrelated, and the CAT scan revealed a spot on her lung. The spot was a tumor, and at age 38, Noce had lung cancer.

"Whether you smoke or not, early detection is the key," she

said. "That's the way you're going to have that five (percent survival rate) turn into 10, 15, 20, more survivors. I need more survivors."

Susan Spagnola, of Circle of Hope, a lung cancer patient advocacy group, said that people must remember that it isn't just smokers that are affected by lung cancer.

"People believe they're protected, they're safe," she said, referring to non-smokers. "The point is that lung cancer is the leading cause of death for both men and women."

# Spartans a step from perfection and title

## But face tough challenge in Delbarton QB

Perusing the final results of the Delbarton School football games this season, this one sticks out like a Santa Claus wearing Bermuda shorts and black knee-high socks.

There it is, the season-opener: "St. Peter's Prep 36, Delbarton 0."

To be sure, St. Peter's Prep just may have the premier high school squad in all of New Jersey this year. But, on the other hand, consider that Delbarton has averaged 37 points in its other 10 outings.

Oh, incidentally, Delbarton quarterback Jack McBride didn't suit up for that game because of a bout with mononucleosis. And Delbarton without him in the lineup is, well, just a pretty decent team.

There's no denying the impact the 5-foot-10, 190-pound McBride makes on the Green Wave, with both his arm and legs. That's something Immaculata discovered first-hand a year ago during a 41-14 loss in the state playoffs, and is certain to re-discover 2 p.m. today when the teams tangle again for the Non-Public Schools Group 3 championship at Rutgers Stadium in Piscataway.

"He is the catalyst — everything we do goes through him," said Delbarton Head Coach Brian Bowers. "He's a great double-threat."

Pierce Frauenheim doesn't have to be reminded.

"For them it all starts with McBride," said the unbeaten Spartans' veteran head coach. "He's a very good athlete who can run and throw and we have to control him."

The Spartans didn't do that quite thoroughly enough in the 2005 playoff semifinals, when McBride passed for 111 yards and ran for another 94 on eight carries during a lopsided victory, the Green Wave's fourth straight over Immaculata in state playoff competition.

McBride, who only became a starter last season when Delbarton's top QB was injured, is somewhat of an interscholastic version of the Atlanta Falcons' Michael Vick. He's rushed for over 1000 yards, both by design and improvisation, and is also a dangerous 1000-yard passer whether dropping back or on

the run. He's the Morris County scoring leader with 19 touchdowns and 116 points and has tossed 18 TD passes.

Seventh-seeded Delbarton (8-3), which doesn't have the overall up-front heft it did a year ago, also counts on steady production from junior full-back Terry White, who's averaging a whopping 13 yards per carry.

"We've been focusing quite a bit on McBride while watching film," said Spartans' senior two-way tackle Ryan Bennett, "but you can see White is very important to them, too. McBride's not afraid to hand other people the ball."

Especially not White, who rambed for 202 yards during the Green Wave's opening-round playoff triumph over No. 2 seed Pope John in Sparta and also has accumulated over 1000 yards on the ground while scoring 12 TDs. He also was effective last year against the Spartans, totaling 92 yards on nine tries.

"We think he's a special player who fights for every yard and does all the little things, like block and catch the ball," said Bowers. "He played a lot as a sophomore and really came alive for us in the playoffs, when he just went off in terms of being a very good player."

With McBride's confident take-charge approach, Delbarton likes to employ a no-huddle shotgun spread offense with two or three wideouts and White as the single back or sometimes paired with junior Andrew Bell.

Bell can also line up at flanker and Delbarton, which has advanced to the playoff final for the seventh time in the last 11 years, also has standout receivers in wideout Max Seligmann (12 TD catches) and tight end T.J. O'Donnell.

"All those guys give us a pretty nice opportunity to spread the field and get the ball to players who can make plays," said Bowers. "Offensively, we're probably better this year in terms of numbers we've put up. We feel if we execute properly the way

we can — and that hasn't always happened — it's going to be pretty hard to stop us because of the balance we have."

The 6-5, 280-pound Bennett, a top-flight offensive tackle who's also started the last three games on defense, noted Delbarton doesn't feature the combination of strength and height on the line it had in 2005. The Green Wave, after all, has lost three times and has yielded an astounding 245 points.

"I think we like to be more physical up front than they do," said Bennett, who's received several Division I-AA scholarship offers plus another from I-A Toledo last week, "and running between the tackles will be a big part of our game. But they still have done a good job jelling as a team and it's always tough going against a team with good chemistry like they obviously have."

#### ALBERT AND RIDDICK

Skyland Conference squads and playoff victims St. John Vianney and Holy Spirit can attest to the same thing regarding the top-seeded Spartans (11-0), who've relied heavily on the 1-2 punch of running backs A.J. Albert and Theo Riddick along with a stingy, swarm-to-the-ball defensive group.

Albert, a senior who began the campaign figuring to see mostly defensive duty at line-backer, is Immaculata's top rusher with 1143 yards on 183 carries (6.3 per try) and has scored 11 touchdowns.

The shifty, speedy Riddick, who's emerged as one of the state's top sophs, is averaging 8.1 yards a carry (1135 on 141 attempts) and is Somerset County's scoring pace-setter with 20 TDs for 120 points.

Junior T.J. Fabiano (31-222) can also be effective in the backfield and junior quarterback Frank DeNick has completed 50 of 96 passes (52 percent) for 758 yards, with six going for TDs and seven getting picked off.

Riddick tops Spartan receivers with 162 yards on a dozen receptions, including three TDs. Fabiano has 14 catches for 161 yards, junior wideout Brad McAdam has six catches for 134 yards (22.3) and 6-3, 230-pound senior tight end Chris Peltack has just four catches but two have gone for

touchdowns in playoff victories.

"Right now the feeling of confidence in our ground game is such that if we don't shoot ourselves in the foot," said Frauenheim, "we think we can go against anyone."

Interior linemen who do so much to make that ground game click include three-year

starters Jack Rice (right guard), John Zetterstrom (left guard), right tackle Bennett and Peltack, while senior center Mike Piscadillo has also been a sturdy performer.

Another individual who's capable of making a difference in a tight game for the Spartans is junior place-kicker Mike Brownnet, who's convert-

ed 37 of 41 point-after attempts and has booted five field goals, four longer than 30 yards.

Bowers has seen enough opponents run up some impressive totals against his defense, so he's aware this test is going to be another in a long line of difficult ones for his troops.

## B-R Junior Midgets earn berth in national finals

TOMS RIVER — Kevin Johnson knew back in August — when the leaves were on the trees, and they were still green — that his Bridgewater-Raritan Junior Midgets were going to be just one of several outstanding teams in the Mountain Valley Conference this season.

But ever, he's just a little surprised three MVC squads are now making preparations for next week's Pop Warner national championship finals at the DisneyWorld Sports Complex in Orlando, Fla.

"This is pretty phenomenal," said Johnson, head coach of the Panthers. "Never in my 14 years coaching in this conference have I seen something like this. Maybe one or two might make it, but never three in the same season."

"But I said at the beginning of the year this conference was loaded with talent," he added. "It says a lot about the caliber of our league."

Johnson's unbeaten Panther Junior Midgets earned their berth in the national "Final Four" Nov. 24 with a 17-6 victory over Asbury Park in the East Region championship game at Toms River South High.

On the same field that day Watchung Hills' Junior PeeWees rocked North Rockland (N.Y.) 25-0 for their Division 2 region title and the Hunterdon Huskie PeeWees also prevailed to advance to the nationals for the second straight year. All three MVC teams will play next week.

The Panther Junior Midgets, the first Bridgewater-Raritan team making a trip to the Pop Warner nationals in the program's 38-year history, are practicing this week and most of the

squad will leave for Florida tomorrow morning.

Weigh-ins are early Monday and they'll work out that evening before taking on a California opponent 1 p.m. Tuesday in a semifinal clash. Depending on the outcome, they'll be in the championship game or the consolation the same time Friday.

Before the Panthers could begin making plans for their trip to Florida, they had to survive their confrontation with Asbury Park's aerial-minded Blue Bishops, who weren't the least bit hesitant about putting the ball in the air on any down at any spot on the field.

Asbury Park had a quick, accurate quarterback and several rangy, athletic receivers who put constant pressure on the Bridgewater-Raritan secondary.

"Our pass coverage was a little shaky," said Johnson, "but we kept the ball in front of us for the most part and got the job done. We hadn't faced a team that throws the ball that much before and their quarterback was like a little Michael Vick. He had a very fast take-off and his receivers ran good patterns. They gave us some fits."

It was a tough victory for the Panthers (13-0), although maybe not quite as difficult as the previous week's 6-0 conquest of 2005 national champ Charm City, when they scored on a drive which ate up most of the clock in the third period.

"I think we were the favorites in this one, so to speak," said Johnson, "and we handled it pretty well. We didn't have our 'A' game but played well enough to win."

Bridgewater-Raritan wasted

little time showing it meant business against the Bishops. On the game's third play Connor Smith took a lateral pass from quarterback Eddie Hopeck and raced 52 yards for a touchdown and Charlie Dorsey drilled the conversion kick through the uprights for an 8-0 advantage.

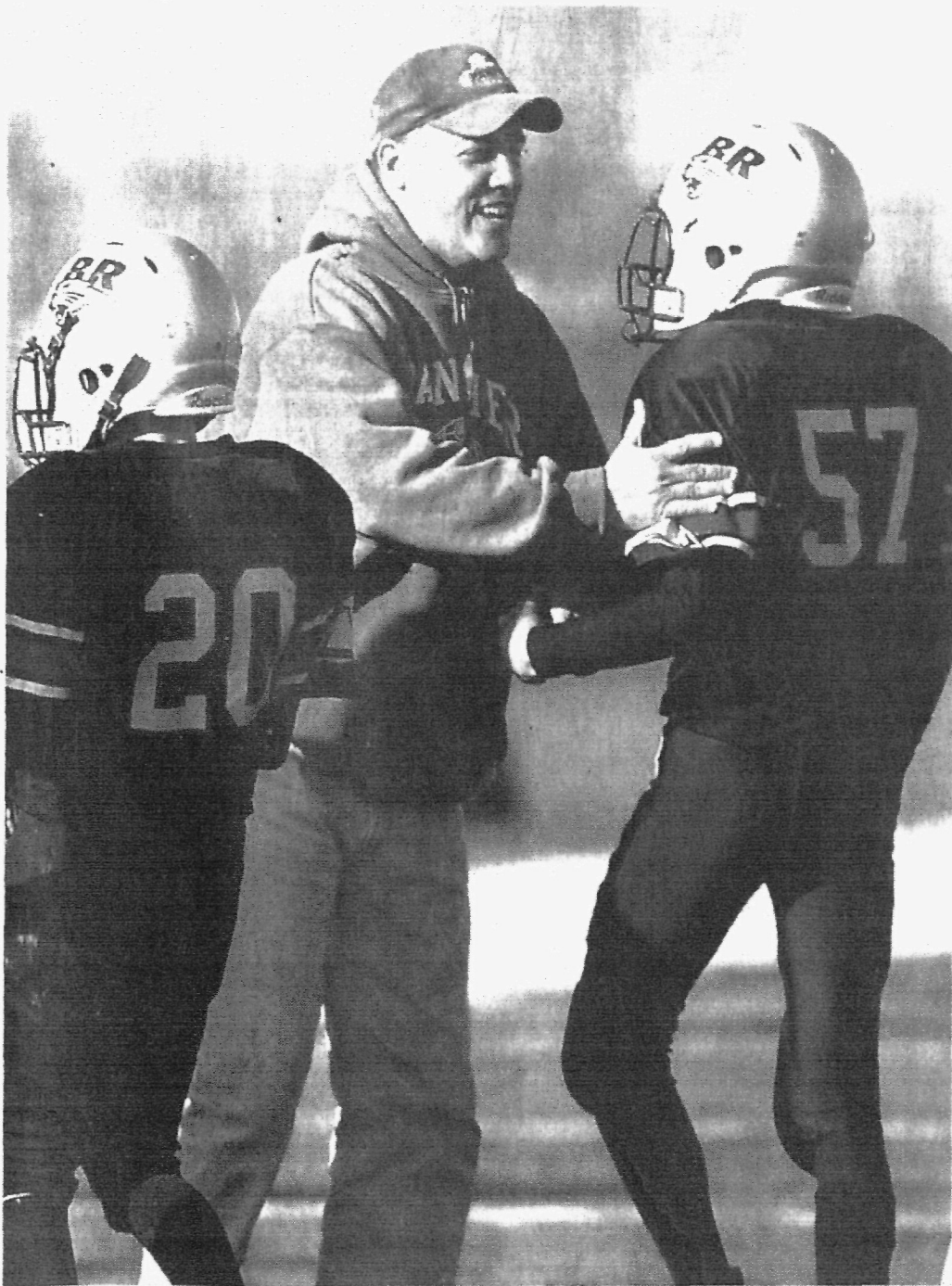
With its passing game clicking, Asbury Park matched 51 yards to a TD early in the second quarter and the point-after kick was good. However, it was nullified by a penalty and the Bishops missed the subsequent attempt, leaving the Panthers clinging to an 8-6 lead.

Bridgewater immediately retaliated on its next possession, with the help of a trick play. On fourth and 10 at the Asbury Park 45-yard line, Hopeck again tossed an overhand lateral to Smith but this time Smith uncorked a pass to tight end Tyler Thomas, who rambled to the 15 before he was tackled.

Moments later Jordan Blair blasted into the end zone from three yards out and the Panthers took a 14-6 cushion into the half-time intermission.

While Bridgewater often begins the second half with an onside kick, this time Asbury Park had a bunch of "skill" players up front in case the Panthers were planning on continuing that pattern. So Dorsey kicked it away and a Bishop trying to scoop up the ball fumbled as he was snatched by Smith, with B.J. Grill recovering for the Panthers at the 15.

The Panthers were soon stopped but Dorsey came in on fourth down and kicked a 27-yarder straight and true between the uprights, his second field goal of the season.
