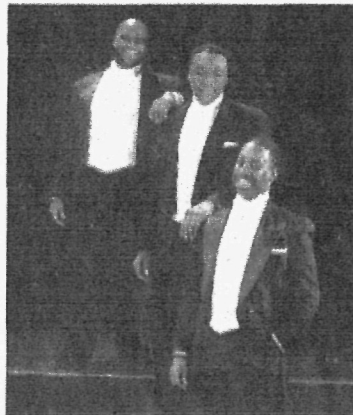

Sing one for the Patriots

EDISON — The Somerset Patriots are holding auditions for people who want to sing the national anthem at Commerce Bank Ballpark this season. Fiction? No, book recycling works

A Middlesex County pilot program to recycle unusable hardcover books has proved to be a success and is now spreading to other locations.

More than 4.2 tons of paper was generated by the South Plainfield School District, which served as the kickoff district for the programs. Students were enlisted to rip off the covers of the books to make them recyclable.

County and local officials are using the program to increase recycling awareness and collection at schools throughout the county.

"The book recycling program in our schools is a great educational tool for students," said Freeholder Camille Fericola, chairman of the county Engineering and Planning Committee. "School officials have helped bring a new excitement to our recycling efforts."

"It's in everyone's best interest to recycle unusable books and important for all of us to encourage students to develop good recycling habits," she said.

Fericola said the program has a number of benefits. Recycled books do not take space in the trash stream; students benefit from hands-on recycling efforts; municipalities save the expense of landfill dumping fees.

The project is the product of a partnership among the Middlesex County Division of Solid Waste Management; the Middlesex County Improvement Authority, which operates the curbside recycling collection program in 16 municipalities; and school districts throughout the county.

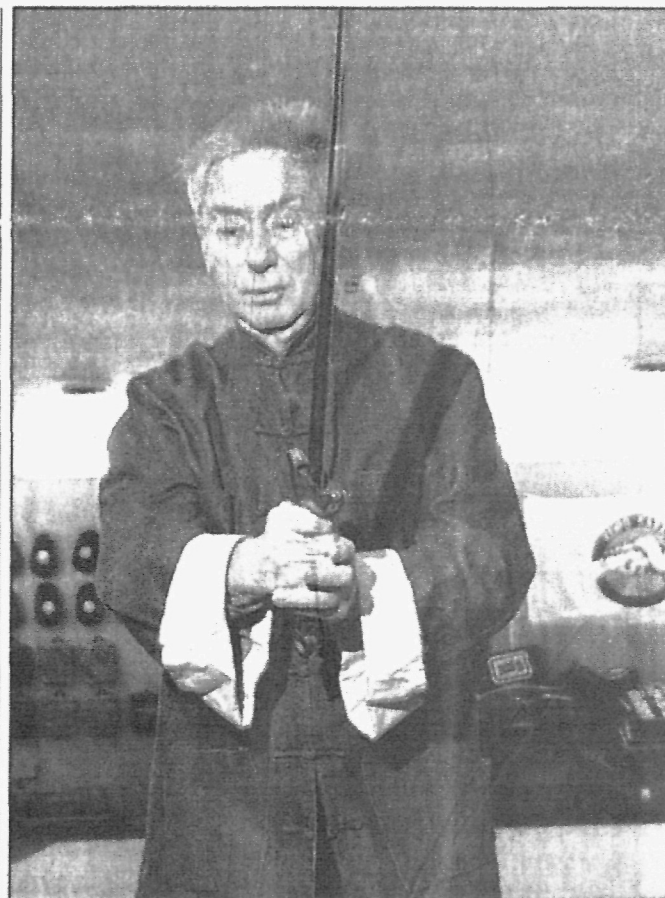
DYFS is looking to local leaders for help

Enter the Dragon, improve your health

MANVILLE — When Paul Sher was a young 35 years old, he was diagnosed with premature arthritis.

His doctor wanted to put him on a cortisone treatment, but Sher, who, along with his wife, owned a pet shop, knew the effects the medicine could have on another important part of his body.

"It would lead to heart failure," said Sher, a Bridgewater resident. "We saw what it did to the dogs."

Instead, Sher took up karate and within 10 months, his body was clear of all aches and pains.

"The arthritis is gone," said Sher, a retired research scientist with Johnson & Johnson.

He went on to practice and teach Karate, Tai Chi, Tai Chi Sword, Shiatsu, Qi Gong and Ninjitsu.

Sher, who has more than 40 years of experience in a variety of martial arts forms, will offer classes at the Red Dragon Martial Arts Academy in Manville. Classes, which will share the basics of Tai Chi, Tai Chi Sword and Qi Gong with participants, will be held 7 p.m. on Fridays starting March 2 and Wednesdays at 8 p.m. starting March 7. Classes will run for at least an hour and are \$10 each.

Over the years, Sher, a Holistic Health Teacher, has taught Tai Chi and Qi Gong at Somerset Medical Center in Somerville, AT&T in Pluckemin, Light Lines Holistic Center in Clinton, Raritan Valley Community College in Branchburg, Samurais Den Karate School in Manville, Yu's Black Belt Institute in Bridgewater, Raritan Valley Health Center in Raritan and at

The power of mind over the body's mechanics

BRIDGEWATER — Physical trainers help athletes prepare and take care of their bodies, while Dr. Mark Weiner, a sports psychologist, does the same for athletes' minds.

Weiner, a licensed psychologist who is employed by Career Consultants Inc. of Union, will hold a free seminar for local athletes, coaches and parents where he will show how sports psychology can increase an athlete's success.

The program will be held 9 to 11 a.m. March 3 at the Somerset Medical Center's Sports Performance and Rehabilitation Center at Commerce Bank Ballpark.

"Athletes are people too," Weiner said. "They have similar issues and deal with the same issues whether it is about family, identity issues or anger and anxiety."

Weiner will teach participants visualization and breathing techniques.

"They should visualize a

success memory or future desires of success," he said. "It could enhance their performance. Visualization is the core method to doing and achieving something."

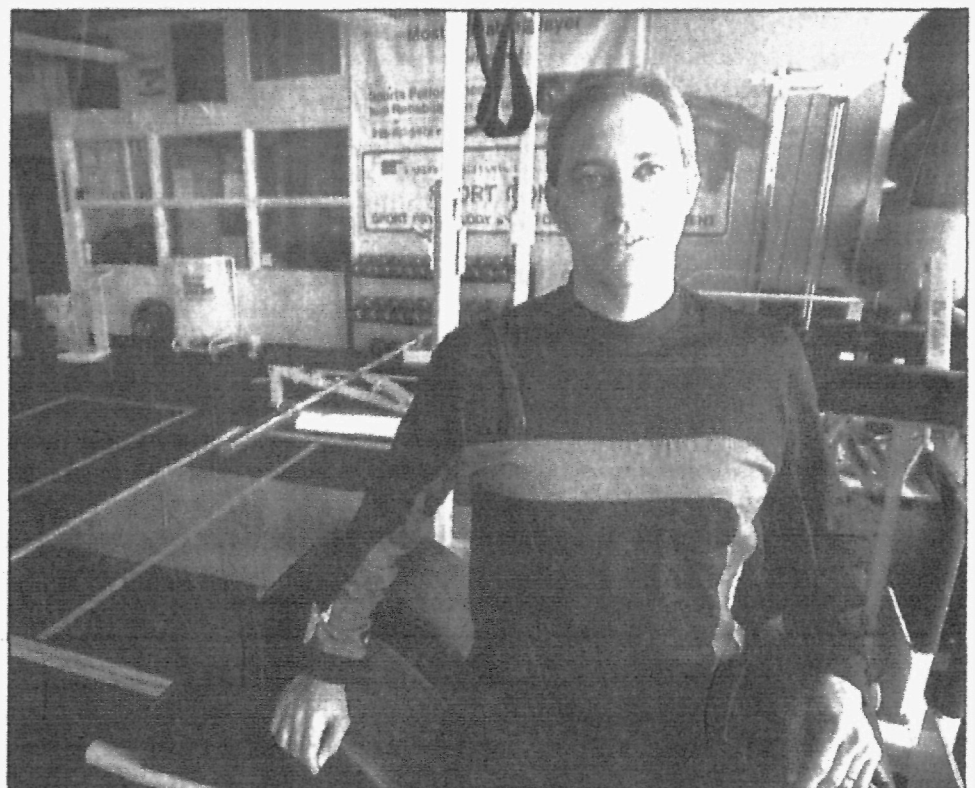
He will also share how internal and external factors can affect an athlete's performance.

"There could be substance abuse issues, a temper or violence," he said. "Some people blame others for mistakes, others don't have the confidence and are afraid to try and make mistakes."

Ryan McMahon, a certified physical trainer at the center, said Weiner's work adds another dimension of service the facility can provide.

"It's a great benefit for us," he said. "He can help athletes on the mental side of things and help them focus. We're not trained to do that. If an athlete has a bad day at school, they might have a bad work out session with us or have a

social services intended to strengthen families. The state intends to fund up to four pilot projects in the first year.

Families referred to Differential Response may voluntarily choose to confer with a case manager and play a key role in identifying local services that will help strengthen the family. Often these families are struggling to attain the basic necessities in life and lack the resources or experience to take advantage of an important array of supportive social services. These include temporary assistance for needy families; child care; food stamps; health benefits; rent or utility assistance; mental health support; and substance abuse treatment.

Based on recent data, DCF records indicate as many as 450 Middlesex County families may have been able to benefit from a Differential Response program in the past year.

Under the direction and leadership of Freeholder Blaquita B. Valenti, the Middlesex County Department of Human Services has engaged myriad social service providers, eliciting support and ideas to develop a truly collaborative Differential Response

pilot initiative.

This setup is "a challenging and exciting cooperative venture, joining many of the key social service providers in Middlesex County, working in harmony to prepare a meaningful proposal with outcomes that will sustain and strengthen families in our communities," she said.

Valenti is also chairman of the county Human Services and Aging Committee.

The RFP requires the county Human Services Advisory Council to take the lead in overseeing the planning, implementation and evaluation of the initiative. Key collaborators helping shape the proposal include the United Way of Central Jersey, InfoLine of Middlesex County, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Metuchen, the Puerto Rican Action Board and the Jewish Renaissance Foundation.

The state RFP encourages the engagement of the grassroots community in developing the array of social services to be provided. The advisory council and agencies planning the initiative proposal is actively soliciting community-based social service agencies to participate.

School, first approached the county about a book recycling program. Before students participated in the program, a pile of unusable books 3-4 feet high lined the wall of the school's cafeteria. Whalen said the school tried to sell or give the books away but no one wanted them.

He said the students received a great hands-on civics lesson.

"These students are a model for everyone else and they should be very proud of themselves,"

Whalen said. "We are very happy with the outcome of the program in our school. We're seeing an increase in recycling awareness in the classroom."

"Our teachers and students are more conscious of recycling and the importance of it," the principal said, "and are making sure paper is going in the right place."

The county and the MCIA contracted with Waste Management of New Jersey Inc. to provide special covered recycling containers to collect the materials. It was first stationed

at Grant School. Eventually all South Plainfield schools participated. The books were then brought to Port Newark for recycling.

Originally the South Plainfield district was to receive \$20 per ton from the recycling facility. Because the quality of the recyclable material was higher than expected, the district received \$50 per ton.

The program is now being conducted in North Brunswick.

Municipalities whose schools participate in the

book recycling program will receive recycling credits from the state, which adjusts recycling subsidies to towns based on each town's volume of recycled materials. The more recycled materials, the higher the subsidy.

The county will receive additional tonnage credits toward its overall recycling rate, whose minimum goal is 60 percent each year.

the Johnson & Johnson Family of companies.

"I practice Martial Arts for health reasons," he said. "It has all the internal systems in the body."

Sher, who produced the "Asian Culture in American" television program that aired weekly for years on Patriot Media and Cablevision, calls Qi Gong a form of moving meditation.

"It has all the benefits of sleeping," he said. "When you're done you feel more alert and your body is rested. You don't have to sit to

meditate."

At 77 years old, Sher, the founder of the Asian Cultural Arts Society, still practices Tai Chi and Qi Gong daily.

"I'll do it until I die," he said. "I owe my life to it. I doubt if I would live this long or be this healthy."

His students have experienced similar health benefits from training in the martial arts.

"One lady — she was about 50 — she said before she started taking the class she had trouble bending down to put her panty hose on," he recalled. "After the eight or 10 week of class, she had no problem. She did great."

Good medicine is offered at pharmacy

WARREN — In 1975, fifth-grader Steve Castronovo wrote an essay about what he wanted to be when he became an adult.

"When I grow up, I am going to be a pharmacist. I am going to help people and give them the medicine that they need and I will give them the things that will make them feel better if they are sick," reads the framed essay that sits on a shelf at Edgewood Pharmacy.

Now, Castronovo, co-owner of the Mountain Boulevard pharmacy with his father Thomas Castronovo, is a third-generation pharmacist. Frank Castronovo, father to Thomas, opened a

pharmacy in Watchung in 1939.

Edgewood Pharmacy, established in 1962 at the Warren Village Center, is the oldest and longest retail business in Warren under the same owner.

With its location in the center of the township, the pharmacy has been and continues to be a community-minded store. It served as a contract branch for the United States Post Office before a post office was opened in Warren.

"People would buy their stamps here," recalled Thomas Castronovo, 70, who opened the store when he was only 25. "They'd drop off their packages or get money orders. It was a nice way to meet people."

At that time, Warren was very different from the suburban center it is today.

"In 1962, I'd stand here and wonder when the next car would go by," Thomas Castronovo said, recalling the township's more rural days. "Now there's a line."

The introduction of managed care has changed the world of pharmacists, Steve Castronovo said.

"Today 95 percent of all prescriptions are billed to managed care," he said. "Its initial focus was to lower prescription prices. In a way, it did in the beginning, but now manufacturers are able to raise the prices because the customers don't always know what the actual price is."

For example, the average

price of prescription was \$3 in 1962. Today, it's about \$60.

Other changes include the types of drugs people are taking.

"There are more and more lifestyle prescription drugs," said Steve Castronovo, offering bladder control drugs as an example. "There are medications that make our lives better. That's a focus being seen nationwide."

But what hasn't changed is personal service and care that both Castronovos offer to their clients. It isn't unusual to find Steve sharing pleasantries and advice with people when he steps out from behind the counter.

"The more people get to

know you, the more they come into your store and the more comfortable they feel," he said. "It makes people feel confident that when they get sick, they know they will be treated properly."

The store also offers 24-hour emergency service and it isn't unusual for either Castronovo to leave the family dinner table to fill a prescription.

"Our customers, especially those with small children, all have my home phone number," Steve Castronovo said. "What's the point of going to the doctor in the middle of the night and having him write a prescription if it can't be filled?"

Additionally, the pharmacy offers car-side service.

"We'll car-hop a prescription," Steve Castronovo said. "If you have a sick child in the car or your child fell asleep in the car, moms call on their cell phone and we'll run it out to the car."

Edgewood Pharmacy has been located in the Warren Village Center since opening nearly 45 years ago, however, it moved to a temporary location for two years to complete an expansion and renovation of the plaza. Now back to its original spot, on the eastern section of the center, the 2,700 square foot facility is brand new. The store also has a thriving retail center.

The following Dunellen Property Maintenance Ordinance for Refuse and Recycling Container Storage, the terms of which are included herein, be and is hereby approved on the first reading, and a second reading and public hearing will be held at 7:30 p.m. in the Dunellen Borough Municipal Building, 355 North Avenue, Dunellen, New

Jersey on the 5th day of March, 2007, and copies of this Ordinance shall be posted on the public bulletin board prior to the date for second reading and final passage and copies of this Ordinance shall be available at the Office of the Borough Clerk for any interested members of the public.

The following Dunellen Property Maintenance Section is amended as follows:

2173, E. Refuse and recycling Container Storage:
(1) Refuse Container Storage:

(a) Garbage and other organic waste shall be stored in watertight receptacles of metal or other approved material. Such receptacles shall be provided with watertight covers. At least one approved type of garbage receptacle shall be provided for each dwelling unit.

(b) In dwellings of two family size or larger, the landlord shall be responsible to provide separate approved refuse containers for each dwelling unit.

(c) All refuse and recycling containers must be stored no closer than the front setback of the building and in all cases shall not be visible from the street. On days when garbage pickup or recycling is scheduled the containers may be placed near the street but they must be returned to regular storage places below down of the following day.

(2) Roll Off Containers:

(a) Temporary Roll Off Containers:

(1) The temporary placement of roll off containers is permitted when required; however, they can only remain on site while active construction, renovation or cleanup is ongoing. They must be removed within one week of completion of the project or the cessation of the project for other reasons. Anytime a container becomes full regardless whether or not the project is completed, it must be removed within one week.

(b) Permanent Roll Off and Commercial Type Wheeled Refuse Containers:

Permanent roll off and commercial type wheeled refuse containers of the type that must be mechanically lifted and emptied by a crane or hoist are permitted but must be enclosed in a six foot high solid fence with chain link solid gates. The fence shall be chain link with 1/2 inch galvanized steel mesh. The gates must remain closed except when the container is being emptied. Every attempt must be made to have these containers the best view from the street. The fence and gates must be maintained in good order.

Big Apple Circus starts Saturday in Bridgewater

BRIDGEWATER — At the Jersey Shore, visitors are dazzled by the lights of the arcades, the sounds of popcorn popping and the laughter and shrills of those on the amusement rides.

The Big Apple Circus will bring a bit of that wonder to the Central Jersey area starting Saturday, when it opens a month-long showing of performances at the Commerce Bank Ballpark.

In the spirit of barkers at Coney Island, the amusements at Worlds Fairs and small time visiting carnivals, the Big Apple Circus welcomes visitors to "Step Right Up!" and enjoy its 29th season.

"It was such a colorful period in history," said Circus Founder and Artistic Director Paul Binder, who noted the show's theme — "Step Right Up!" — was inspired by and pays tribute to carnivals and fairs held between the 1860s and 1920s.

In a welcome note to circus visitors, Binder mentioned the Columbian Exposition — a fair held in Chicago in 1893 to mark the 400th anniversary of Columbus's arrival in the new world. While the event featured thousands of speakers and exhibits, a majority of the visitors never made it to "the world's fair proper," Binder said.

"The amusement area was thought of as an after

thought," he said. "But more people went there than into the actual fair."

The area included the 250-foot Ferris wheel, the Houdini Brothers and even Buffalo Bill. While there won't be a Ferris wheel inside the big top, with the theme of "Step Right Up!" the Big Apple Circus promises to share the sights and sounds of a midway with its spectators. Acts include Yasmine Smart and her carousel of horse, aerial ballet by Irina and Andrey Perilyev, bicyclist Justin Acrobatic, the Zhengzhou Acrobatic Troupe, the Muttville Comix dogs, jugglers, dancers and of course, clowns and

The show's creative team created a mystical performance, bringing together modern days amusements with influence from past fairs.

Composer Michael Valenti wrote an original score for the production that includes waltzes, a little rag time, some classical music and the sounds of an old time amusement park.

"It was a very eclectic mix of music then," he said. "It was right at the turn of the century and in America, people were still listening to European music. It was right at or right before rag time came about."

As a result, his score exhibits the influence of Johan Strauss, Irving Berlin and Scott Joplin.

"There's some callopie, a lot of brass and reeds," said

Valenti, who has written music for the circus for the past six years.

Scenic Designer Todd Rosenthal added to the midway theme with a collage of signs reading "Amazing," "World's Greatest..." and "Enter at Your Own Risk."

"It had to be something mystical," said Rosenthal, who in his youth worked at the Riverside Amusements in Massachusetts. "It took an amusement park look and scaled it down for the big top. We have the Test of Strength and a hotdog cart with an umbrella. There's a neon Tunnel of Love sign."

While not every audience member will be old enough to remember the glory days of Coney Island, most can appreciate the show's nostalgia, Binder said.

"I remember going to Coney Island with my father, but by the time I was a kid, it was fading," he said. "But overall, we all long for a simpler time. We all have that yearning even if we've never been there."

Performances of "Step Right Up!" begin Saturday and run for 32 shows through March 25. Tickets range from \$12 to \$49 and are available through Ticketmaster, may be purchased in person at the Community Box Office at the Somerset Hills YMCA in Basking Ridge, by phone at (908) 766-7898, Ext. 10 or at the ballpark starting March 3. Immaculata teams shooting for titles

Spartan boys again will face Panthers

Count Jeff Cullinan among those who fully subscribes to the old "third time is the charm" theory.

At least that's how the Immaculata High junior forward was feeling a week ago just moments after the Spartans had ousted Hillsborough from the Somerset County Tournament, setting up another clash with Bridgewater-Raritan for the championship.

SCT BOYS PREVIEW

"We're gonna take 'em," said Cullinan. "It's all about intensity. We have to come out from the start and stop their scorers. But I feel good about it."

The Spartans' defense obviously was up to the challenge of stopping Hillsborough's scorers during their 54-41 semifinal victory. But doing the same against top-seeded Bridgewater-Raritan, which is seeking its fourth straight SCT title, figures to be a tad more difficult once today's finale tips off at 3 p.m.

For one, the Panthers have already defeated Immaculata twice in Skyland Conference-Delaware East Division action this winter. Secondly, B-R will enjoy the home-court advantage, although that may not be as crucial as might generally be surmised, considering the Panthers slipped past Immaculata 62-59 after almost blowing a 15-point fourth-quarter lead on their own floor in their previous meeting Jan. 30.

Bridgewater-Raritan, which also defeated Immaculata in last year's SCT final, barely survived its semifinal test against a Franklin team it had dominated twice earlier this season, edging the Warriors 39-36.

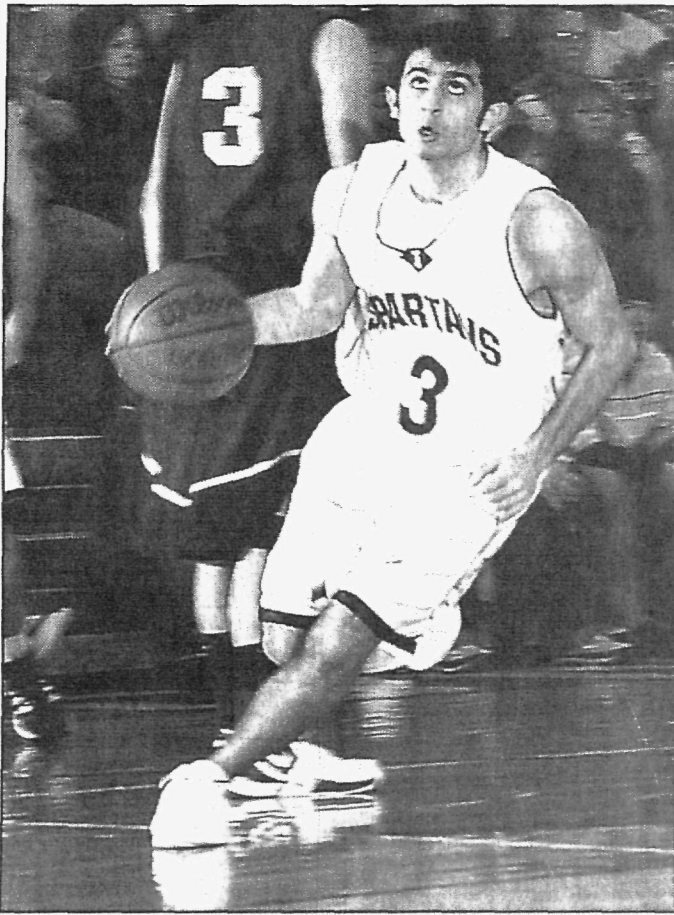
Head Coach Tim Ortelli has spent the week readying his Panthers for their almost-annual county title battle against a school that hasn't captured an SCT championship since 1985.

"They want us, and now they've got us," said Ortelli. "They know what we do, we know what they do. I'm not concerned with them at all. We have something Immaculata desperately wants. They're a senior team and I'm sure last year's loss gives them a lot of motivation."

"It's a basketball game. Whoever plays the best and puts the ball in the basket is going to win."

Immaculata Head Coach Mike Frauenheim concedes the task of knocking off the Panthers, who have 6-foot-6 senior James McNally and 6-7 junior Andy August patrolling the front court, isn't going to be easy, especially at this stage of the campaign.

"I'm not quite sure what we need to do to beat them," said Frauenheim, a starting guard on that '85 Immaculata title team. "They have probably the best coach in the state of New Jersey and they have

so many weapons. I don't think they have any weaknesses to exploit."

Besides talent, B-R also has some imposing history on its side. Since the Bridgewater-Raritan district consolidation in 1991, the Panthers have reached the county final 12 of 16 seasons and come away with nine banners.

On the other hand, it's not like B-R has been rolling over opponents right and left, either. The Panthers squeezed past Immaculata 45-43 in their first contest Jan. 9 and just held off the Spartans again three weeks later.

And Franklin, which had suffered a pair of 23-point conference losses to B-R, came within a whisker of sending last week's SCT semifinal to overtime. The Panthers were playing without guard Jared Rothbard, who's sidelined with mononucleosis and is questionable for the final.

"We need to get more production from some people or we're going to be in trouble," said Ortelli. "Hopefully, we'll have Jared back, but if we don't we'll go with who we have. Obviously, they have some kids who do some nice things. We have to defend and rebound. There's not going to be any tricks."

The Spartans will try to slow down McNally, the county's top scorer at 20.1 points per game, inside while also keeping in mind August (10.6), Keith Woung-Fallon, Dave Pilla and Rothbard can find ways to score some points if left unattended too long.

"If you double down on McNally, Woung-Fallon will hit threes," said Frauenheim. "And Rothbard and (Ryan) Merten are totally solid guards. You take away one option and they have four others on the floor."

However, those options weren't delivering too often against Franklin.

"We need to be able to make open shots," said McNally. "They usually double down on me, so that means someone is going to be open."

McNally scored 39 points during B-R's first two victories over Immaculata and August and Woung-Fallon had 21 apiece.

"McNally is going to get his 20," said Cullinan, "and August is going to chip in. Their high-low with those two is tough to play against. Me and (Brent) Freid have to get on them — we have to push each other this week in practice."

In the most recent Spartan-Panther encounter junior reserve guard Jamal Mohammad fueled a furious late Immaculata rally and finished with 19 points, one less than senior backcourt mate Brian Kerwin. But Cullinan, plagued by early foul trouble, scored just four points after tallying 15 and grabbing nine rebounds in the initial meeting.

"We need a monster game from everyone on the team to beat them," said Frauenheim. "We have to be hitting on all cylinders. We can't give up any possessions. We have to limit our turnovers to minus 12 and maybe if we do that we can keep it close and execute down the stretch and win a close game."

It will only be close if Cullinan, the Spartans' second-leading scorer at 12.4 points per game, makes his presence felt early and often and the senior guard duo of Kerwin (14.5 ppg) and Jason Cimino can assert itself and create problems for their rivals. Kerwin has been tough to contain for just about every Immaculata opponent and Cimino, a three-year starter at the point, is an adept ball-handler and passer.

"To contain Cimino," said Ortelli, "you have to come up on him, and if he goes by us that draws more defense. What he does best is make his teammates better by dishing it off. Kerwin is a different player. He's very aggressive on offense and looks to shoot more often, so we try to give help on him, try to stay in his face and make him work hard — which he will do."

Surging Spartans one step from glory

For Jen Hilgenberg, this is familiar territory.

During each of her four seasons playing guard for Immaculata High, she was involved in Somerset County Tournament final-round games, helping hoist the championship trophy three times.

Now, as the Spartans' head coach, she's doing all she can to help steer her team in the same direction — while getting them to relax about the whole situation at the same time.

"I just want them to approach things like it's just

another normal Tuesday night game," she said. "I don't want to start panicking them. I want to keep their anxiety down."

But there's no doubt the Spartans have plenty to be excited about. In one of the most unlikely championship-game matchups in SCT annals, Immaculata will face seventh-seeded Montgomery 1 p.m. today at Bridgewater-Raritan High.

No. 4 seed Immaculata is playing in its first county final since 2004, when the Spartans fell to Rutgers Prep 34-32 to end their five-year SCT championship run. The previous winter, Immaculata had toppled Hillsborough, which marked the sixth successive time the schools had tangled for the title.

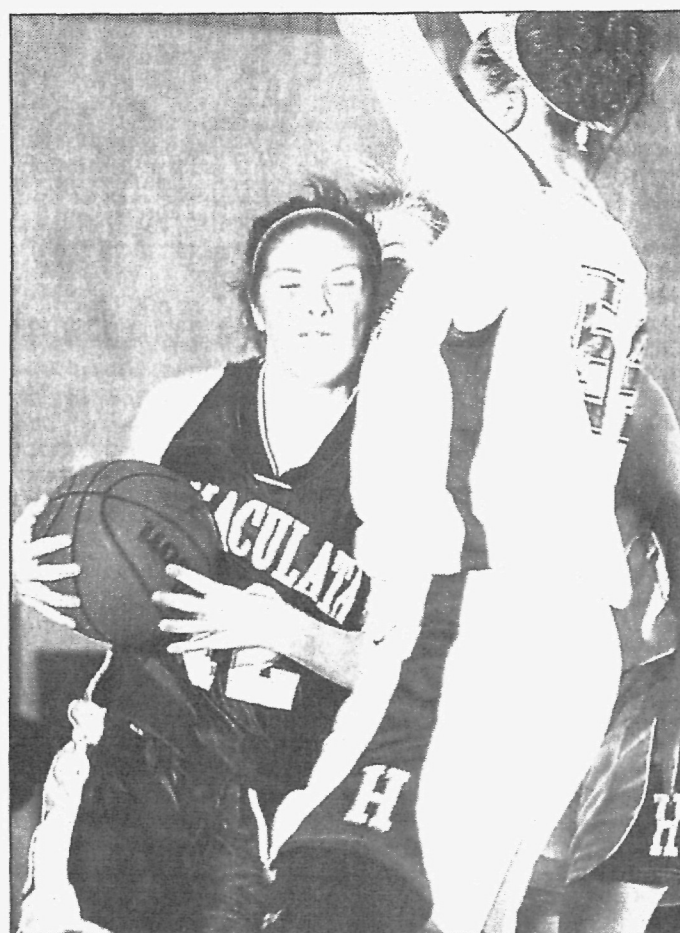
So, while Immaculata obviously has a voluminous SCT background, the situation is quite the contrast for Montgomery, as this young Cougar squad will be the school's first entry to reach a county final. It's actually quite an accomplishment for both teams, considering each began the season with 1-5 records.

"To be honest," said Hilgenberg, "I've been talking with our girls all year about what it takes to win big games, about the county games we played when I was at Immaculata and then some games we had in college (Villanova). I think they have an understanding of what it's like to get in the spotlight."

"In the locker room after we beat Hillsborough, talking about the county finals, their eyes were just so big and they were so excited," said Hilgenberg, referring to Saturday's 49-43 semifinal triumph over the top-seeded Raiders. "They're so pumped up, and this is such a big week for the entire school because the boys are in the finals, too. But we still have to try to go about things as if it was just another game on our schedule."

If Immaculata (14-9) can do that in this particular case, it should come home with the crown because the Spartans have already defeated Montgomery (11-11) twice this winter in Skyland Conference-Delaware East Division clashes.

Immaculata trimmed MHS 46-42 in the season-

opener behind senior guard Caitlin Bay's 14 points and teammate Lindsay Melone's 10. In the Jan. 23 rematch in Somerville, Bay (13), junior forward Meg Kotalic (11) and Melone (10) were in double figures during a 53-39 verdict after the game was deadlocked at halftime.

But county tourney history is brimming with cases of teams, girls and boys, knocking off opponents they'd already lost to twice earlier in the season. The same thing almost happened a week ago when the Bridgewater-Raritan boys narrowly escaped with a 39-36 decision over a Franklin squad they'd ripped twice by 23-point margins.

"I think our girls know how hard it is to beat a team three times," said Hilgenberg, a 2001 Immaculata graduate who played in two NCAA tournaments with Villanova. "We've been watching Montgomery the whole season and some of our players have even commented that Montgomery reminds them of us. They play like a team, they move the ball well, they do all the little things right, and they're tough and scrappy."

"Montgomery has been playing excellent basketball and this really should be a tough game for both teams. We know it's going to be a dogfight and we're going into this as if it's another game against a Number One seed."

With just one senior — 5-foot-11 Ellen Killian — who sees much court time, Montgomery has shown flashes of promise this season but the Cougars seem to be putting all the pieces together when it counts the most.

They began their SCT run with a 77-53 rout of Gill St. Bernard's, then stunned sec-

ond-seeded Watchung Hills 58-52 before thoroughly outplaying No. 3 seed Franklin 48-34 in the semifinals behind sophomore guard Marcia Voigt's 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists.

Killian and 5-9 soph Laura Coletti give MHS a size advantage over the Spartans in the front court, especially with 5-9 Immaculata soph Stephanie Perovich lately sidelined because of illness and still looking doubtful for the final.

"They're taller and stronger," said Hilgenberg, "and it's going to be very important for us to box out. We have to be patient, keep moving the ball and just keep digging if they stay with us the whole game. We have to keep digging back at them."

"They'll make us play defense, and we have to do the same thing back at them. And even if they're not going in at first, we have to keep shooting because they'll eventually start to fall."

The 5-6 Melone, who reached the career 1000-point milestone during Monday's regular-season victory over Roselle Catholic, figures to be the primary defensive target of Montgomery, which has shown both man-to-man and zone looks during its first two games against the Spartans.

Melone, who entered the week averaging 13.4 points a game, was particularly impressive in the SCT semifinal, scoring 24 points (one short of her career best) and adding five steals and four assists. But the Cougars are also well aware of what a dangerous shooter Bay can be, as evidenced by the fact she is Immaculata's leading scorer at 14.6.

Melone stars for Spartan girls

SKILLMAN — Considering she'd waited her entire four-year varsity career before getting this kind of an opportunity, Lindsay Melone wasn't about to sit back and become a spectator to see how things turn out.

The Immaculata High senior guard almost single-handedly kept the Spartans in the game during the opening half, then gladly watched her teammates contribute mightily down the stretch Saturday afternoon during a 49-43 triumph over top-seeded Hillsborough in the Somerset County Tournament semifinals at Montgomery High.

Melone's 24 points represented almost half of Immaculata's total against

the Raiders, who'd been seeking a third straight county championship. In fact, she scored 20 of Immaculata's first 26 points before Brittany Muscatell, Caitlin Bay and Megan Kotalic combined for the next 17 as the fourth-seeded Spartans came from behind to gain a 43-38 lead with just over two minutes remaining.

While Melone was the standout, Bay also had a productive game with 14 points, including two straight three-point bombs midway through the final quarter.

The Spartans had already proven they could defeat the Raiders, since they posted a 45-32 victory in a Jan. 26 Skyland Conference-Delaware East Division

meeting after Hillsborough had won the first meeting of the season between the squads.

Bay's trey from the top of the circle against the Raiders' man-to-man defense with 4:15 left staked the Spartans to a 41-36 lead and actually turned out to be their final basket.

Then Hillsborough went to a 1-3-1 zone trap and Immaculata, whose lineup is basically comprised of five guards in both a physical and tactical sense, handled the ball smartly and patiently, forcing the Raiders to foul. The Spartans sank eight of 10 attempts from the charity stripe the rest of the way to seal the decision.

Defense boosts Spartan victory

SKILLMAN — The end result wasn't too bad for a team that took a grand total of two shots, missing both, in the final quarter and also committed five turnovers during that time.

But Immaculata's boys had done more than enough before that, at both ends of the floor, to allow their free-throw accuracy seal the decision down the stretch Saturday afternoon as the second-seeded Spartans defeated Hillsborough 54-41 in the semifinal round of the Somerset County Tournament at Montgomery High.

The Spartans' rugged man-to-man defense challenged No. 3 seed Hillsborough at every turn, virtually shutting down outside marksmen Tom Molarz and Steve Westphal, and their near-50 percent shooting during the first three periods staked them to a hefty 42-27 advantage entering the last stanza.

Jeff Cullinan, a 6-foot-4 junior forward, paced the Spartans with 15 points and nine rebounds, senior guard Brian Kerwin had 13 points and junior reserve guard Jamal Mohammad 12, while the combined frenetic

perimeter defense of Kerwin, Jason Cimino and Tim Sanderson gave Hillsborough fits all day.

Immaculata took a 15-point lead into the final period, then sank 12 of 17 free-throw attempts the rest of the way as the Spartans' patient offensive tactics forced Hillsborough to foul.

The Raiders connected on just 12 of 41 field-goal tries (29 percent) including a 1-for-10 showing beyond the three-point line. Immaculata shot 19 for 42 (45 percent) and also converted 15 Raider turnovers into 18 points.

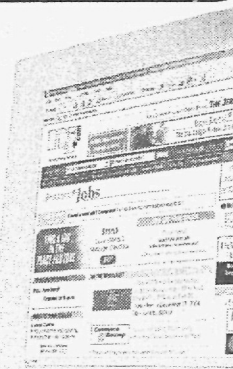
