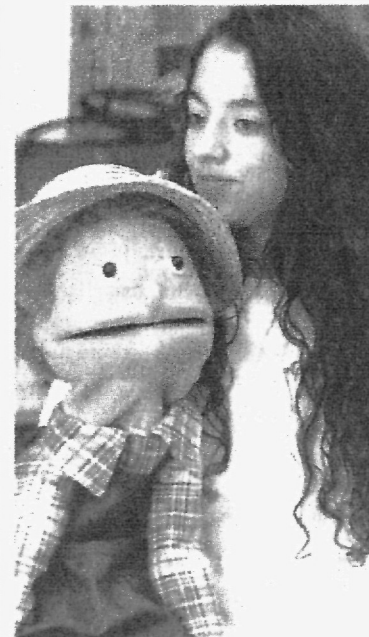

## Graf running as Republican

Ever since John Graf Jr. pulled his name for consideration by the county Republican committee for the Board of Chosen Freeholders, he's received a slew of phone calls and e-mails saying he should get back in the game. Late last month, Graf, the chief executive officer for the Somerset County United Way, withdrew his name and announced that he will run as an independent Republican during June's primary election. His withdrawal was a result of what he says is rule-breaking by fellow candidates. Graf alleged that candidates have been endorsed and lobbied for by other officials and municipal committees, which goes against the rules set out for candidates going through the screening process. However, after the rush of correspondence, Graf has decided to reenter the screening process earlier this week. "The system is not perfect, but I made a mistake," Graf said. "I let other people's comments and actions determine my actions." Although he acknowledged that the screening process is flawed, Graf wants to stand by his party. "It's in my best interest as a candidate to be unified with the Somerset County Republicans," he said. "I've been endorsing them for over 20 years." Should he not receive endorsement from the Republican committee, Graf said he will not run in the primary race.

## Program lends hand to families in need

Middlesex County is vying to be a select pilot program that would help families in need receive supportive services locally while at the same time help the Division of Youth and Family Services with its caseload.

The New Jersey Department of Children and Families has asked counties in the state to develop a Differential Response pilot initiative.

Differential Response involves taking calls from Division of Youth and Family Services that do not rise to the level of child abuse or neglect and provide an array of supportive social services intended

to strengthen families. The state intends to fund up to four pilot projects in the first year.

The Middlesex County Board of Chosen Freeholders has adopted a resolution encouraging the county to submit such a proposal.

Families referred to Differential Response may voluntarily choose to confer with a case manager who would work with the family in identifying local services. These could include temporary assistance for needy families; child care; food stamps; health benefits; rent or utility assistance; mental health support; and substance abuse treatment. The key compo-

nent to the initiative involves family involvement in needs assessment and selection of services.

Based on recent data from the state, nearly 450 Middlesex County families may have been able to benefit from Differential Response in the past year.

"Often these families are struggling to attain the basic necessities in life and lack the resources or experience to take advantage of an important array of supportive social services," said Freeholder Blaquita B. Valenti, chairman of the county Human Services and Aging Committee.

"This is a challenging and excit-

ing cooperative venture that taps into each group's strengths and experience in supporting Middlesex County families," she said. "Our joint effort will result in a meaningful proposal that will help sustain and strengthen families in our communities."

The county's Human Services Advisory Council is required to take lead in overseeing the planning, implementation and evaluation of the initiative. That group is working closely with a number of social service providers to develop a collaborative proposal. Key col-

## Neither snow nor frigid cold could keep the pupils away

BASKING RIDGE — With temperatures in the teens and wind chill factors making it feel below zero, the naturalists at the Environmental Education Center at Lord Stirling Park conducted the first indoor maple sugar program.

Third graders from the Irene E. Feldkirchner Elementary School in Green Brook originally planned to visit the center on Feb. 15, but a snowstorm postponed those plans until March 6. Last week, when freezing temperatures hit the area, the students and teachers didn't want to put off the trip again. They couldn't reschedule.

"We didn't have another date available," Naturalist Christa Wood said. "We had to improvise."

And so the pupils were split in half — one group learned about the process of making maple sugar and syrup from the sap of a maple tree while the other group viewed a wildlife presentation. After lunch, they swapped places.

Typically, the maple sugaring program involves a walk through the forest to the Sugar Shack sap is boiled down to make sugar and sap. Along the way, visitors can see maple trees tapped for sap. But last week, the pupils sat attentively in a classroom listening to Wood's entertaining lessons on how to produce the sugary goodness.

"Nobody knows when maple sugaring first started," she said. "But we can make an educated guess."

## Rutgers plays host to annual walkathon

PISCATAWAY — More than half a million babies are born too soon every year. Many die. More than 120,000 babies are born with serious birth defects that can mean a lifetime disability. That's why the March of Dimes is leading the national fight to save babies from premature birth — the leading killer of newborns — and from other serious threats to infant health.

## Raritan Valley helping to 'launch' moon program

NORTH BRANCH — With a little help from NASA, the New Jersey Astronomy Center for Education at Raritan Valley Community College and Princeton-based scientist Edward A. Belbruno will be helping take students to the moon.

The partnership, called "Going Back to the Moon," will develop lectures designed for different age levels about Belbruno's experience

with the Hiten Spacecraft and gravity, orbits, and motion, as well as offer workshops to educators that will help train them to teach their students about gravity and orbits.

"The challenge was really to take what he's doing and transform it into something that would be useful in the classroom. Not just something we think is cool, but that will be useful in the classroom," said Wil van der Veen, director of teaching institute for the center at RVCC.

There will also be a design challenge for high school students that centers around building a moon base, said van der Veen, a project that gets students to think about how it could be done, where it would be put, and the most cost-efficient way to design and build it — a project that fits into both Belbruno's research and state science and technology curriculum standards.

Belbruno's work involves applying

chaos dynamics to space travel to more efficiently transport unmanned spacecraft and equipment from the earth to the moon.

"You've got to give the rocket a big boost to get to the moon, and that uses energy. Then, once you get to the moon, you're going way too fast, which also uses energy, so you're using energy twice," said van der Veen, explaining the problems Belbruno's research is trying to solve.

## Maple Sugar

An old legend indicates that an American Indian tribe in the Northeast discovered the tastiness of maple sugar by accident when the wife of the chief used water from a bucket placed under a maple

tree where an ax had pierced the bark. She had used the water to make a stew.

"When they were done the chief said, 'This is the best venison stew you've ever made,'" said Wood.

From that point, Wood explained how early colonists advanced the tapping of trees, collection process, boiling and storage of maple

sugar. In modern times, sugar farmers use plastic taps and a hose line to connect all the maple trees on the tap line to a central collection point. Even with the advancements, the process can be labor intensive, said Wood who likes maple sugar so much that she taps two trees at her home.

"It takes 40 gallons of sap to

get one liquid gallon of syrup," she explained.

At the end of the presentation, the pupils sipped a taste of the thick 100 percent maple sugar.

"It doesn't taste good to me," Elana Kirschner said. "It's too sweet, but I like the story about how it's made and learning about all the different kinds."

For her classmate Liam Diller, it was just right.

"The syrup tastes great," he said. "At first it has a weird aftertaste, but it was good after that. It's pretty cool how to learn to tap the trees for syrup."

The program complemented lessons the children learned in school, teacher Suzanne Scannell said.

"We read the story 'Little House in the Big Woods' and Laura Ingalls (Wilder) has a big section about sugaring," she said. "And in third grade, the children learn about natural resources and caring for the environment. We also talk about the groups of (American) Indians and the different resources they have."

# No strings attached ...

## Students use puppets to teach younger generation

SOMERVILLE — Clayton the Crab and his friend Handy, a duck, came to Van Derveer School to help teach the young pupils about sharing and getting along.

The two, along with their fellow puppet friends, arrived courtesy of the Applebee Pond Players, a group of Somerville High School students that perform the shows for the younger children four times a year.

"They're so into it. Every time we come back, the teachers tell us how excited they are, so it feels good that you made an impact," said Ashley Marshall, a senior at Somerville High School who has been performing with the group for four years.

As Clayton the Crab, she needed a hammer to pound a nail into the ground so no one would get hurt. But Handy, played by fellow senior Stephanie Salazar, wouldn't share the hammer, because Clayton didn't know how to use it and it was Handy's favorite hammer.

"My favorite part was when he needed the hammer," said Elizabeth Doku, a pupil in Dunstan's class.

"Have you ever had that happen to you? When you needed something and no one would give it to you?" Salazar asked. "It's still important to ask nicely."

The two plays, one about being sad and another about sharing, were followed by a game, where the students led their young charges in making different animal sounds to respond to a story about a group of jungle adventurers.

In Ashlee Dunstan's class, the students voted the

hyena sound their favorites, while Susan Biuso's pupils embraced the lions and the elephants over the parrots and monkeys.

"I liked it when we played the game, because it was really fun," said Ashlyn Jess, who got to roar as a lion and mime an elephant's trunk as part of the game.

The high school students practice four times prior to each of their four visits, said Janice Fusaro, the student coordinator for the high school, and most of the students involved have been members for their entire high school careers.

Though the younger children had fun, the program is a part of the district's character education program,

and the older students said that the kindergarteners' and first graders' memories of the puppets from previous times is proof the younger students are getting the message.

"They're learning. You can tell they remember, and we reinforce that," said Brenda Contreras, a senior and 3-year member of the group. "It shows that they pay attention."

The district-wide character education program focuses on different aspects of building positive character traits, and the schools offer programs throughout the year aimed at helping their students focus on those lessons.

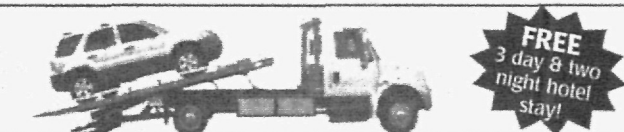

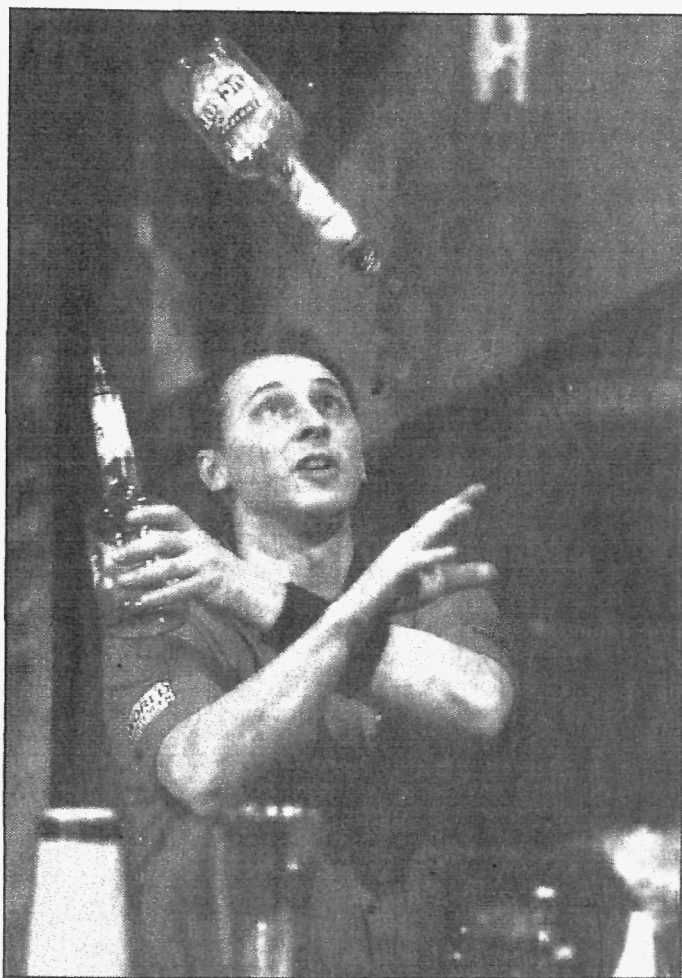

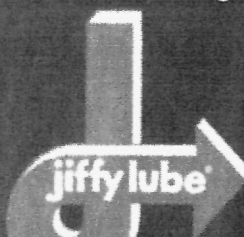

# B-R again sets sights high

**BRIDGEWATER-RARITAN** — Just about everyone who suits up for Bridgewater-Raritan High this spring has some sense of what's needed to reach the state championship game.

But actually taking the floor and filling all the necessary roles and accumulating the points to do so is another matter. It's likely to take some time before this collection of Panthers can expect to achieve what the past two B-R squads have done — play for a state title.

"Realistically, right now, we're not a state championship-caliber team," said Panthers Head Coach Corey Romanak. "Some of the guys were supporting players on last year's team, others saw what they did as they were sitting on the bench, and the JV team also watched them."

"They all have seen what it's like to get there, and we all want to get there. That's every team's goal."

In the Panthers' case, it's been quite an attainable goal. Two years ago Devin Zolnowski sparked B-R to its sixth state championship — and first since 1994. After the Panthers struggled to

even qualify for the tournament last spring, they quickly put the pieces together to make another run behind Chris Allen, and again advanced to the final, ultimately dropping an exciting three-game battle with St. Joseph-Metuchen.

Senior Chris Metzger looms as the key cog in the attack this year but plenty of other variables also have to fall into place before the Panthers, who went 17-10 overall last season, develop into a contender.

"This year it's a little different," said Romanak. "The past two years we've had guys like Devin and Chris Allen. This year we have Chris Metzger, who's done a great job mostly as a supporting-type player the past two seasons. But he has to step up and assume more of a showcase role this year — as does the entire team."

"I will say our goal is to get back to the finals," he added, "and we have the potential to make that a realistic goal. And the reason isn't that we have such overwhelming talent on the team, but because our atti-

tude going into the season is that we're all somewhat humble.

We know how far we have to develop to get to the state finals. We'll take our lumps but by the end of the season, we can be polished enough to make a run.

"It's tough to assess everything this early in the year. All the players are good but they all have to get better at the same pace and as a group they have to be on the same page as the coach."

There's no doubt the Panthers are sorely going to miss the imposing presence of the 6-foot-5 Allen, who became just the ninth player in state history to reach the career 1000-kills milestone during last June's 25-16, 17-25, 29-27 setback to St. Joe's in the state title clash.

But the 6-1 Metzger, who also played well that night in South Brunswick, figures to be a highly-productive outside hitter for the Panthers.

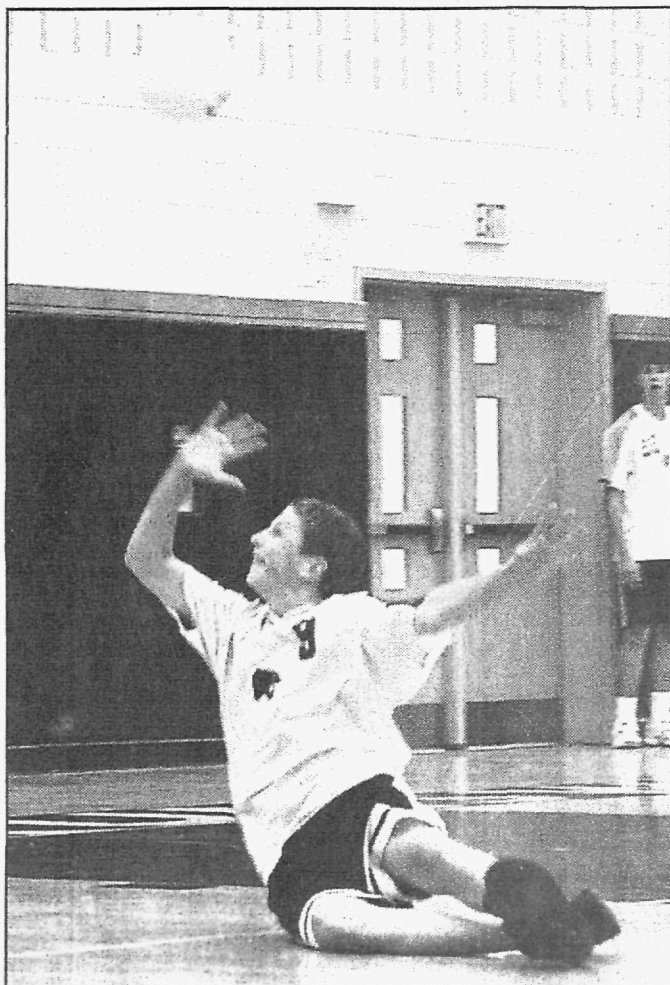
Another proven performer is 5-7 setter Andrew Conkin, who was a huge factor in B-R's late-season sprint to the North Jersey sectional crown and totaled 33 assists in the state final.

"This is the first time in several years I have a setter I don't have to train from the beginning," said Romanak, whose troops launch the season April 4 at home against Watchung Hills. "He's a senior who knows what I want him to do offensively."

Senior Pat Raines, a starter in the middle last spring, is also being counted on as is lanky 6-2 sophomore Norbert Mikolajewski. Mikolajewski saw action for both the junior varsity and varsity in 2006 but could turn into a standout during the next two months.

Raymark DeQuina, a 5-6 junior who's improved considerably after seeing virtually no court time a year ago, has been sidelined by illness recently but possesses a vertical leap over 30 inches and should boost the Panthers' attack when he's healthy. Senior Kevin Chang, who played JV ball last year, could help on the perimeter as well.

Returning from last year's club are seniors Jason Shun, a lefthanded hitter who'll get some right-side action, and Mike Nicotra, a versatile player who can help the Panthers just about anywhere.

# Panthers oust Ridge to reach state hockey final

**EAST RUTHERFORD** — In two previous meetings with its biggest rival, Bridgewater-Raritan High's hockey team owned the third period. Unfortunately, in each case an early deficit proved too much to overcome.

That wasn't the case Saturday night.

Down by a goal entering the third session, the Panthers scored three unanswered goals and claimed a 4-2 semifinal victory over Ridge at the Continental Airlines Arena to reach the NJSIAA Public Schools Tournament final for

the first time. B-R took on Randolph for the title last night.

When Nick Loughlin knocked home a rebound off a shot by Chris Tommins with 4:04 remaining, B-R had finally come all the way back from an early hole after losing 4-3 and drawing 2-2 in two earlier games with second-seeded Ridge. But in those games, the Panthers had outscored the Red Devils 5-1 in the last period.

What happened in those contests set the stage for the Panthers' strong finish

Saturday night, according to Head Coach Patrick Alvin.

"The first time we played Ridge we were down 3-0 after two periods and lost 4-3. The second time we were losing 2-0 and we tied 2-2," he said. "When I went into the locker room between periods I just told the guys we've been here before and let's just finish it this time."

"It felt great to put together three solid periods of hockey. We executed our game plan the way we wanted and we have the results to show for it. We played a great all-around

game — offense, defense and special teams. It was a great victory."

Knowing they had the capability to come back against Ridge (23-2-3) gave the Panthers confidence going into the final period.

"We've always been able to come back against them for whatever reason," said senior Kevin Wetmore, who scored B-R's first goal and added an empty-netter with three seconds left. "We always play good in the third period against them, so we never really felt like we couldn't win. It

made it easier to come back this time only being down by one."

Chris Tommins set up the winning goal when he dug the puck out of the corner and got off a shot against the Ridge defense. Devil goalie John Lyons deflected it but Loughlin knocked in the rebound to make it a 3-2 contest.

Loughlin found himself untended by the Ridge defense and had no problem getting the puck past Lyons after collecting the rebound for his 17th goal of the season and by
