Chronicle's last issue is next week

Next week's issue of *The Chronicle*, which publishes April 28, 2007, will be the final publication of the newspaper.

Begun in Bound Brook in 1859, *The Chronicle* has been serving the borough and surrounding communities for 146 years. The newspaper was purchased by NJN Publishing in the 1990s and, in 2003, when *The Reporter* was launched, *The Chronicle* was merged with various Middlesex County papers also published by NJN Publishing, including the *Metuchen-Edison Review*, *South Plainfield Reporter* and *Piscataway Review*.

The decision to end the newspaper's publication is part of a plan to better-focus NJN Publishing's efforts in Somerset County.

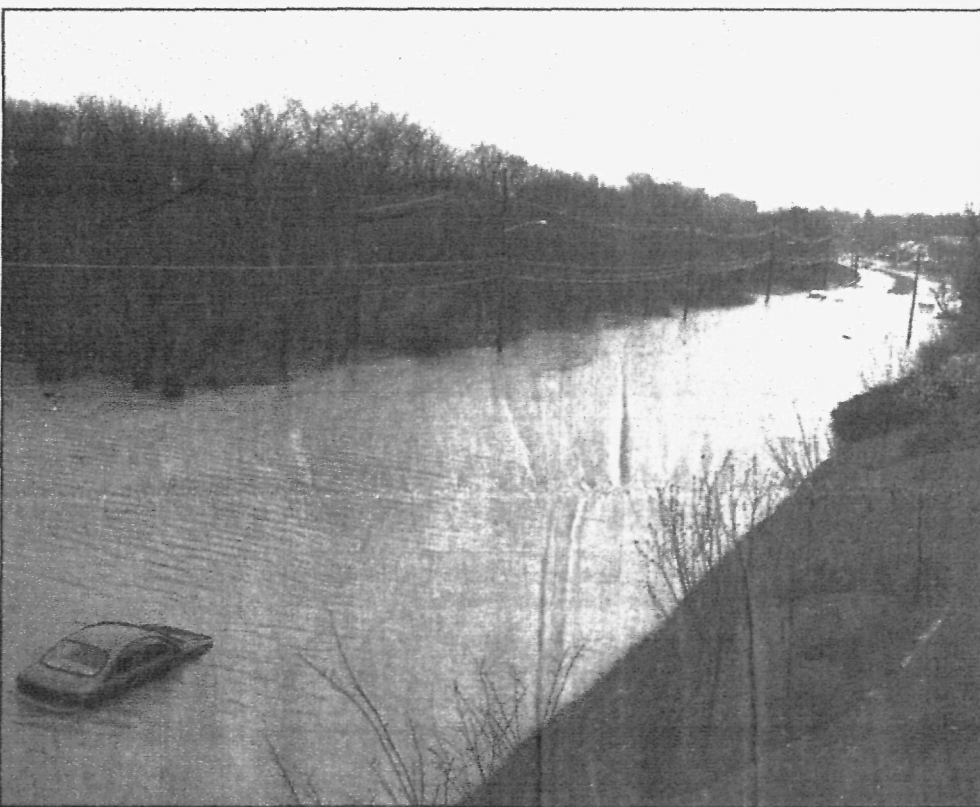
It began with a whimper and ended as one of New Jersey's worst natural disasters. When the National Weather Service first issued a severe weather alert late last week, few could have imagined that by Monday thousands of residents of Bound Brook, Manville and Somerville would be evacuated from their homes.

The nor'easter that swept through the Northeast Sunday left devastation Monday, and a community, still trying to put the memories of 1999's Tropical Storm Floyd behind them, in a state of shock.

The good news is that the waters are receding and the clean-up and recovery can begin. The bad news is that for many this is not the first time, and probably will not be the last. This storm will leave lingering memories and concerns, not least of which is the question of when will the Green Brook Flood Control Project finally be completed. This project, given priority status in the wake of Floyd, now leaves public officials to struggle each year to eek out minimal funding from the Army Corps of Engineers' budget.

The *Somerset Reporter* is putting together a campaign to urge our public officials, and the Corps, to give the flood control project the funding needed to complete the work. Firefighters face off in blood donation drive

SOMERVILLE — Local firefighters are saving lives in more than just one way.

In addition to extinguishing flames the firefighters are lining up to donate blood to the Somerset Medical Center blood bank.

Somerville's four volunteer fire companies — Lincoln Hose Company, West End Hose Company, Central Hook and Ladder Company and Engine Company No. 1 — are involved in a month-long blood giving competition. The company that donates the most blood to the blood bank by the end of April will receive a pizza party.

So far, 13 firefighters donated blood and almost another 30 have made appointments to come in during April. The competition is head-to-head. Lincoln Hose Company is in the lead as 10 of its members made appointments to give blood. Engine Company No. 1 is close behind with appointments scheduled by eight members.

The competition is the brainchild of JoAnn Yackowski, the hospital's blood donor recruiter.

"I'm always looking for more ways to get people in here," she said. "We could always use more blood. These guys do so much to help our town already. This is another way they can save lives."

Capt. Brian Iselin of Engine Company No. 1 was relaxed while he sat in the donor chair to give blood last week.

"The competition is a great idea to promote donations throughout the community," he said. "We're all volunteers and we always want to do what we can to help others."

He is thankful Yackowski reached out to the Fire Department for help.

Just as they would in the time of a fire, "if we get a call, we're going to respond," Iselin said.

Don Steinert, a 25-year member of Central Hook and Ladder Company who is scheduled to give blood later this month, said the decision to participate in the competition was a no-brainer.

"I'm healthy so I feel like I should do my part to help others who aren't in good

health," said Steinert, who previously was a regular donor. "I'm hoping to get back into giving regularly again."

He added that firefighters are natural givers and hopes the contest generates even more donations.

"It's in our blood," he joked. "To have competition is always good, but I'm not at all worried about getting that pizza pie. I'm doing it because I feel in my heart it's the right thing to do."

All the blood donated at the blood bank is reserved for patients at the medical center. "Your blood stays right here," Yackowski said.

To Iselin, that's important.

"About 90 percent of us (firefighters) are longtime Somerville residents," he said. "If I'm going to donate blood, I'd like it to be for the community."

"Firefighters give so much back to the community," said Ken Bateman, president and chief executive officer of Somerset Medical Center. "Their donations will continue to help us help those who need it. We are proud and thankful to be a part of such a giving community."

The blood bank is open for donations between 8 a.m.-7:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. To make an appointment, call (908) 685-2926.

Middlesex County holds Health Expo in Edison

EDISON — The Middlesex County Public Health Department holds a Health Expo from 1-5 p.m. Saturday, April 21 at the center court in Menlo Park Mall.

Information and activities will be available for the whole family, free of charge. Children can learn about chemical safety from "Wally the Wise Guy" turtle and may try on protective emergency response clothing. Emergency public health vehicles can also be viewed just outside the mall entrance.

Services for adults include blood pressure screening and the opportunity to talk to health professionals about adult and children's health programs. Participants can view public health videos or participate in activities to win prizes by playing Nutrition Jeopardy and Wheel of Misfortune, an interactive drug and alcohol awareness game. Additionally, through the use of puppets, the Lead Prevention Program will explain lead dangers and screening procedures.

There will also be opportunities to register to become a volunteer. The Medical Reserve Corps and Rape Crisis Intervention Center will be registering volunteers to enhance these existing programs.

Numerous tables of free health information will be displayed by the Middlesex County Public Health Department and other public health partners. These include the Middlesex County Improvement Authority, which will feature MC Blue the Recycling Robot; the Middlesex County Mosquito Commission, which will display live mosquitoes and larvae for participants to observe; the Middlesex County Division of Solid Waste Management; and the Edison Department of Health and Human Services.

"Education and outreach to the community is an important element of public health," said Freeholder John Pulomena, chairman of the county Public Health and Education Committee. "This health expo will provide county residents and their families an opportunity to acquire knowledge of the services provided by the Public Health Department and our partners."

"Participants will be provided with education on public health programs, initiatives, preparedness and emergency response capabilities," said David A. Papi, director of the county Public Health Department. "I am encouraging county residents to participate in this event and to have fun while visiting the interactive exhibits and speaking with our public health staff."

FLOOD-RELATED INFORMATION

— Taxpayers directly impacted by the storm have until midnight April 26 to meet their tax filing obligations without incurring late filing and payment penalties. Affected taxpayers can mark their paper tax returns with the words "April 16 Storm." Taxpayers who e-file their returns can use their software's "disaster" feature, if available.

— Recycling pickups around Somerset County have been delayed because of the storm. Recycling pickups for the week will be done as soon as possible. Residents are asked to leave their recyclables at the curb.

— Both Manville and Bound Brook have been granted approvals to postpone Tuesday's school elections.

more information.

On Tuesday, the Raritan River — the source of much misery in Bound Brook and Manville — was still between three and six feet above flood level at 5 a.m., according to the National Weather Service. It was not expected to fall below flood stage until late Tuesday.

The Millstone River was also still more than seven feet over flood stage at Blackwells Mill in Somerset County Tuesday and was not forecast to recede to below flood stage until yesterday morning.

The damage caused by the storm will easily top \$80 million, making the state eligible for federal disaster assistance, acting Gov. Richard Codey said Monday. The Federal Emergency Management Agency sent damage assessment teams to New Jersey and four other northeastern states to have a look for itself.

"Although we have had federal response teams in the states before the onset of the storm, the local, state and federal Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) teams

are the 'boots on the ground' needed to look at the extent of the damages," said Stephen Kempf, Jr., the New York regional administrator for FEMA. "Once we see what the scope of the damage is, this will help us determine if there is a need for federal assistance."

More than 1,100 Somerset County residents woke up Tuesday morning in shelters after a night in which a SWAT team patrolled the streets of Bound Brook to prevent looting.

The Somerset County Prosecutor's Office also mobilized its SWAT team to help State Police and six National Guard soldiers patrol Bound Brook and guard against possible looting, said Somerset County Deputy Emergency Coordinator Thomas Bittle. A team of about 15 to 20 SWAT team members were called on following a request for help from Bound Brook authorities, Bittle said.

Lt. Michael Gannone of the Bound Brook Police Department said the request was not sparked by any incident, just a "little bit of preventative security." The teams patrolled inside the flooded areas, particularly around downtown businesses, but Gannone said the night passed quietly.

"It's pretty much calm," Gannone said.

There are five emergency shelters in Bound Brook and one at the VFW post in Manville.

In Bound Brook, where,

on Tuesday, water was still running two feet deep through parts of the Main Street business district, a new shelter at the Lafayette School was set up Monday night to relieve crowding at the high school shelter, where some 620 people had registered.

A group of some 40 evacuees voluntarily moved from the high school to the new shelter Monday. Malcolm Plager, emergency services director for the Greater Somerset American Red Cross chapter, said he expects the Lafayette School shelter to take between 160 and 200

evacuees from the high school.

The Red Cross is looking at reducing the number of shelters in Bound Brook to just one in hopes of reopening schools on Monday, Plager said.

Manville saw a drop in those needing emergency shelter. Some 152 evacuees remained at the VFW post Tuesday, down from 220 people during the day Monday, Plager said. The St. Mary's Church shelter was closed down. A shelter at the Hillsborough Municipal Building was also closed Monday night.

Sgt. Jim Paterno of

Manville Police said the Sheriff's Office helped police and one unit of the National Guard overnight but no evacuations were necessary.

Red Cross officials, with the help of experts coming in from Pittsburgh, were expected to be sent out Tuesday to do an advanced damage assessment, Plager said. Until now, the agency has been working to shelter and feed evacuees and has not had a chance to assess the damage sustained due to the storm, Plager said.

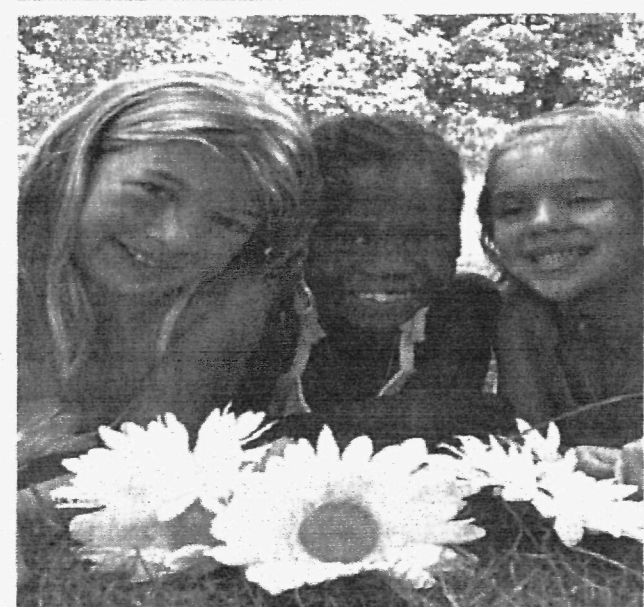

Artist spins tale at show

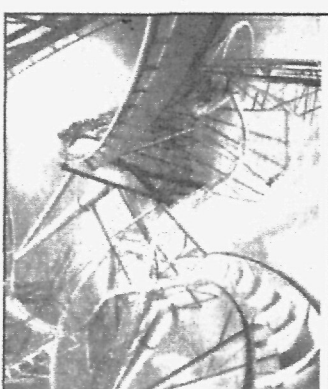
Emerging artists Carla Falb of Warren and Paul Santoleri of Philadelphia took the Noyes Museum in Oceanville by storm with their wildly colorful and energetic images in "Spinning Worlds: Emerging Artists," which continues through April 22.

Both artists use vivid color, movement and imagination to explore their own fantastic landscapes.

Falb has been painting for over 20 years, receiving her Master's Degree in Painting from The University of the Arts in Philadelphia in 2003. Between 2001 and 2003, Falb created the Roller Coaster Series, a sequence of 20 paintings in oil, charcoal, watercolor and ink that depict the artist's fascination with the metaphorical meanings in the coasters' physical structures, turns and drops.

Falb sees her work as a connection to the complexities and emotional existence with the spiritual world — an interest that began during discussions with her father, a Methodist minister. Falb's Roller Coaster Series presents a twisted network of track soaring through the sky in a seemingly endless movement that propels the viewer into the artist's imaginative world.

"Our universe is in continuous movement," says Falb, "the interaction of subatomic particles, the flow of blood in our circulatory systems, the speed of vehicles on

highways, and the rotation of planets. My paintings depict the essence of those movements using the roller coaster as a launching point for the viewer's imagination."

Today, Falb is a fine arts teacher at Ridge High School in Basking Ridge.

The Noyes Museum of Art was founded in 1983 to collect, preserve and exhibit American fine art, crafts and folk art with an emphasis on New Jersey artists and folk art forms, reflecting the area's long traditions, history, landscape and culture.

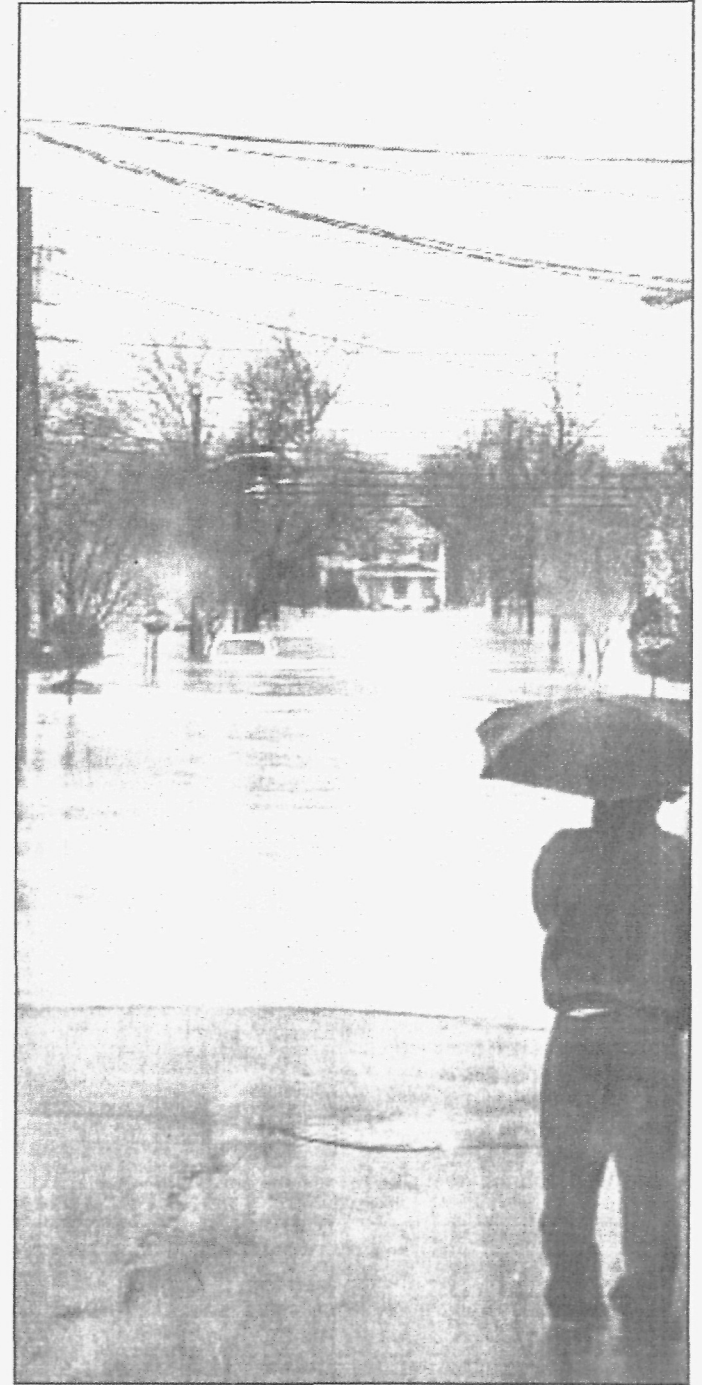

Recycling Center opens doors on Earth Day

BRIDGEWATER — The Somerset County Recycling Center, located at 40 Polhemus Lane, will hold an open house in celebration of Earth Day on Friday, April 20.

The public is invited to schedule a guided tour of the Recycling Center between 9:30-11 a.m. or 1-2 p.m. Registration for tours is requested by Monday, April

16. Tours will take about 40 minutes. To register, call Recycling Coordinator Stacy Grillo at (908) 231-7109.

"Somerset County handles close to 37,000 tons of recyclables a year from curbside pickups at more than 117,000 households," said Freeholder Rick Fontana, recycling and solid waste management liaison. "Last year, we were able

to divert more than 34,800 tons of waste from landfills."

During the tours, residents will observe the recycling process as materials and paper are dropped off by curbside trucks and then sorted and processed on conveyor belts. Materials are then baled and loaded onto trailers to be taken for recycling.

An interactive discussion will be held on the merits of "closing the solid waste loop" by recycling, reducing, reusing and participating in backyard composting.

One of two videos will be shown during the tour, depending on the age group. A video targeted for children is titled "Recycle Rex." The other video, titled "The

Cooler Can," is targeted for a young adult audience and explores the benefits of aluminum recycling.

The Division of Solid Waste Management offers educational programs for schools, civic organizations and environmental clubs on recycling and composting. Upon request, the recycling coordinator will visit schools to con-

duct presentations, or students may schedule a visit to the county's state-of-the-art recycling center to see the recycling process in action.
