This issue marks the final edition of *The Chronicle*.

The paper has its roots as the *Bound Brook Chronicle*, which published in Bound Brook from 1878 to 1892. The paper's name was then changed to *The Chronicle*, a name that stuck from 1892 to 1941 before the paper's name changed again, this time to *Bound Brook Chronicle*.

That title lasted through 1960, when the paper changed names again — this time back to *The Chronicle*.

Bound Brook itself was incorporated in 1891, although it was first settled in 1681, having been established near the Bound Brook stream of the same name. A wooden bridge over the Raritan River was erected as early as 1761 and named Queen's Bridge in 1767, becoming one of the borough's most famous landmarks. Later it became a covered bridge, and during the American Revolutionary War, the bridge was used repeatedly by both sides, including during the Battle of Bound Brook in 1777.

In more recent times, the paper has been sold several

times before being purchased by NJN Publishing. After C. Palmer Bateman Jr., the president of Somerset Press Inc., which published *The Chronicle*, passed away in 1986, the chain was purchased by Malcolm Forbes.

In 1997, Forbes Inc. sold the paper — as well as the rest in the chain — to North Jersey Newspapers Company, which later changed its name to NJN Publishing.

NJN Publishing, in 2003, merged *The Chronicle* with several Middlesex County-based newspapers it also published: *The Chronicle* in the Middlesex-Dunellen area, *The Piscataway Review*, *The Reporter* in South Plainfield and *The Metuchen-Edison Review*.

Although *The Chronicle* is ceasing publication, NJN Publishing will continue to produce *The Somerset Reporter & Messenger-Gazette*.

That paper will re-launch next week with a new format.

"The newspaper is changing to a more compact, easier to read tabloid format that will feature full color on all pages," announced

Craig Turpin, executive editor.

The addition of color will mean a dynamic presentation of advertising and local community information for readers, said Turpin. "As

we're making this improvement, we're also going to combine the paid circulation paper *The Somerset Messenger-Gazette* with *The Reporter*," Turpin explained. "We found that most read-

ers of the *Gazette* also received *The Reporter*."

Merging of the two titles will eliminate some duplication of effort and cost, and put all of the paper's efforts into a single publication.

Health department issues flood fact sheets

On Monday, the Middlesex County Public Health Department delivered fact sheets on flooding and mold to 20 municipalities within the county.

This was accomplished by four health department employees conveying the health education materials to the assigned Registered Environmental Health Specialist within the municipality. After the specialist received the information it was then provided to the local libraries, municipal buildings and other key areas within the towns.

Additionally, facts sheets on septic and well maintenance were provided to the southern county municipalities of East Brunswick, Monroe, Plainsboro and Cranbury. Those with questions or concerns regarding their well or septic can call the Middlesex County Water Pollution Division at (732) 745-8856.

In order to provide these essential materials to residents and retail food establishment owners the Middlesex County Reprographics Department produced over 13,000

assorted copies of the seven different fact sheets. Fact sheets can be also be acquired by visiting <http://co.middlesex.nj.us/publichealth/health-alert.asp>.

Simultaneously the department performed 63 retail food inspections in Milltown as a result of loss of power within the municipality. An Inspection Division Strike Team performed the inspections to ensure that food products were being held at proper temperatures. All meat and dairy products that were found to be out of tempera-

ture for more than four hours were voluntarily destroyed.

"The retail food establishment owners cooperated fully with the REHSs during their inspections. Establishments even utilized dry ice and refrigerated trucks to ensure safe temperatures of their food products," stated David A. Papi, director/health officer of the Middlesex County Public Health Department. "As you know it is important to protect yourself and your family members during an emergency.

Remember to practice basic hygiene and wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds if you come into contact with flood waters and keep children and pets out of flooded areas until cleanup has been completed. If your retail food establishment has been affected by the flood, promptly call your local health department."

Area leaders making the call for flood aid

BRIDGEWATER — In response to the recent flooding in Somerset County communities, the Somerset County Business Partnership Friday brought together representatives of Bound Brook, Manville, and Somerville with County, State, and Federal officials to plan disaster relief for the three communities.

In attendance was staff from the offices of Sen. Frank Lautenberg, D, congressmen Rodney Frelinghuysen, R-11th, and Mike Ferguson, R-11th, assemblymen Upendra Chivukula, D-17th, and Jerry Green, D-6th, Assemblyman Kip Bateman, R-16th, Freeholder Director Bob Zaborowski, Freeholder Deputy Director

Denise Coyle, Manville Mayor Angelo Corradino, Somerville Mayor Brian Gallagher, Bound Brook Mayor Frank Ryan, South Bound Brook Mayor Rich Eickhorst, and various staff from each municipality.

Key items discussed included the current status of each of the communities, the pending Presidential designation as a disaster area, business damage inventories, and the need to advocate for complete funding for the Green Brook Flood Control Project.

A letter to President Bush and all elected official on the state and federal levels was signed by County and municipal officials requesting immediate designation as a disaster area to allow

for the allocation of federal funding.

Upon designation as a Federal Disaster Area, the Business Partnership will take a lead role lead in assisting business owners by providing technical assistance as business owners assess their damages.

"These communities need help and they need it right away," stated Jeff Horn, president and chief executive officer of the Business Partnership. "Many businesses are still paying back disaster loans they received to recover financially from the damage caused by Tropical Storm Floyd in 1999. If they don't get the help that they deserve,

County food network aiding flood victims

EDISON — MC Foods, Middlesex County's emergency food network, has offered to donate cereal and other goods to a community food pantry that was flooded in the April 15 nor'easter.

Hands of Hope for the Community lost 50 boxes of cereal and bundles of clothing. The food pantry is in the basement of St. James Episcopal Church, which got 6 inches of water.

"We are going to help stock their pantry as soon as the basement is sanitized," said Jennifer Apostol, coordinator of the MC Foods program for the

Middlesex County Improvement Authority.

MC Foods is an acronym for Middlesex County Food Organization Outreach Distribution Services. The agency has a long history of helping neighbors, donating 1,000 pounds of supplies to the Franklin Township Food Bank that was flooded by Hurricane Floyd.

MC Foods recently wrapped up its annual school food drive. The 164 public and private schools — the highest participation level in the drive's 11-year history — collected 50 tons of food to be distributed to 60 food pantries and soup

kitchens. The event is a joint effort of the Middlesex County Roads Department, Middlesex County Public Property Department, Middlesex County Parks and Recreation Department and MCIA Division of Recycling. Once containers and grocery bags are delivered to the participating schools, students and faculty have two weeks to bring in supplies. Several schools collected money that was used to purchase supermarket gift cards.

The top three schools were Middlesex County Academy for Science, Math and Engineering Technology, which collected 5,782 pounds of food; Campbell School in Metuchen, which collected 5,650 pounds; and East Brunswick High School, which collected 3,650 pounds.

Apostol said she is pleased with the strong showing of support, especially given the shortage of food MC Foods was experiencing prior to the food drive.

"The students really came together to help the community," she said. "Everyone should feel very proud."

Freeholder Blanca Valenti asked that everyone continue to support MC Foods throughout the year. "We have a good amount of food now but it will be gone in no time," the freeholder said. "We ask that residents continue to drop off food at one of our permanent collection sites."

Residents may drop off food at public libraries in Dunellen, East Brunswick, Edison, Metuchen, Milltown, Monroe Township, North Brunswick, Perth Amboy, Plainsboro, South Brunswick, South Plainfield, Spotswood and Woodbridge.

Food pantries and soup kitchens are currently in need of peanut butter, tuna, cereal, macaroni and cheese, rice, soup and other nonperishable goods.

MC Foods is looking for volunteers to help out during the National Association of Letter Carriers' annual food drive on Saturday, May 12. Volunteers are needed throughout the day to help letter carriers with loading food collected on their routes and sorting food collected during the school food drive. Middlesex County announces a plan to help the homeless

The Middlesex County Comprehensive Emergency Assistance Services Committee has presented to the Board of Chosen Freeholders "Under One

Roof," a 10-year plan to end homelessness in Middlesex County.

The plan, presented in early March, addresses issues such as affordable

housing, supportive housing, mainstream resources, health care and discharge planning.

Instead of relying on emergency shelters, hotels or motels, the plan recommends the Housing First model, which immediately houses an individual or family in an apartment and provides security deposits, rent and supportive services. Eighty-five percent of individuals involved in

Housing First across the country remain in housing. The cost for Housing First is \$1,200 a month to house a family in an apartment compared to \$2,400 a month for an emergency placement.

Based on its 2006 Homeless Survey, the committee determined that at least 500 units of housing are needed to end homelessness in 10 years in Middlesex County.

The plan is "ambitious,

realistic and achievable," said Freeholder Blanca B. Valenti, liaison to the Middlesex County Department of Human Services, which administers the committee.

"I look forward to the freeholders' endorsement of the plan and I am encouraging the board to support a kick-off event to launch the program," she said.

Last year 830 homeless people were counted by the Middlesex County Point in Time count of the homeless. The count found 182 people living on the street or places

not meant for human habitation. There were 197 homeless families and 99 chronically homeless individuals; 18 families were unsheltered.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has mandated that all counties funded under the homeless Continuum of Care develop 10-year plans to end homelessness.

With school, extra-curricular activities and teens in mind, MADE always schedules events that are after school and local. As teens move forward in their academic journey, they will find that community service hours are imperative for college bound students.

MADE is a program run by teens, for teens and continues to make it easy for teens to access volunteering opportunities around their area in order to receive their community service hours for schools, scholarships, and religious groups.

By promoting volunteerism to adolescents around, numerous organizations will be benefited by the extra help and in the end, hopefully achieve MADE's main goal: "Making A Difference Everywhere."

Along with the other helpful services MADE provides, MADE's web site contains members' up-to-date community service hours within the click of a button. Some of the events that MADE partakes in includes working with the elderly, the homeless, disabled/handicapped children/adults, animals, the earth and other major organizations dedicated to helping others. The Enterprise High School students are receiving a new backpack stuffed with binders, pencils, and other necessary school supplies, along with other little surprise to remind them they are not alone.

On April 3, several MADE members attended the backpack stuffing event at Ash's house. Bright and early in the morning they got ready for the event, lining her deck with tables and chairs, and then situating the school supplies and backpacks in their proper places. They began stuffing the 100-plus backpacks and the thousands of school supplies, and at 1 p.m. Bridgewater Mayor Patricia Flannery and Christine Schneider, the superintendent of recreation, came to visit them to see how they were doing.

MADE has given teens a chance to not only get active in their community, but a chance to reach out to kids half way across the country.

Patriots sign former Immaculata player

2007 line-up takes shape as team heads south

BRIDGEWATER — The Somerset Patriots continue to finalize their 2007 line-up as they begin spring training in Florida.

The Patriots announced the signings of right-handed pitcher Casey Cahill and outfielder Sean Gamble.

Cahill posted an 11-0 record and a 0.44 earned-run average as an Immaculata senior in 2000. He allowed four runs and struck out 109 batters in 63 innings to cap a career that included a school-record 28 wins.

Cahill has experience in the Baltimore Orioles organization, including time at the Triple-A level. Cahill, a New Brunswick native, was drafted in the 10th round of the 2000 draft by the Orioles.

He joins former Patriots Chris Eickhorst and Tony Gsell as Immaculata stand-outs that have been signed by the Patriots.

Gamble was a sixth-round draft choice of the Philadelphia Phillies in 2004.

He is a career .269 hitter with 105 runs scored in 212 games and spent the past two seasons in Lakewood.

Gamble is the son of Oscar Gamble, who had a 17-year Major League career that included time with the New York Yankees and the Philadelphia Phillies.

Over the last week, the team had also announced the signing of former Major League outfielder Adrian Brown.

Brown has nine seasons of Major League experience with the Pittsburgh Pirates,

Boston Red Sox, Kansas City Royals, and the Texas Rangers. He has a Major League career .258 batting average with 166 runs, 293 hits, 44 doubles, eight triples, 11 home runs, 86 RBI, and 45 stolen bases in 447 games played.

Brown played 25 games at the Major League level for the Rangers during the 2006 season. He also spent 36 games at the Triple-A level last season, and finished with a .295 batting average 15 runs, 36 hits, 11 RBI, and 11 stolen bases.
