A grade average of "D" (65-69) for the full year, including all four marking periods plus two semester exams (if applicable), will be a passing grade.

This new grading system will only effect the high school students, but will most likely be plemented in all grades in the next few years.

Police candidates are chosen from a Civil Service list issued by the state. The list is compiled using scores from written and physical tests, with the highest ranked first.

# **Local Tax** Rate to Remain Flat in 2004

Mayor Gallagher and the Borough Council announced at last week's meeting that the borough's portion of the 2004 tax rate will be flat at .861. This is the fourth time in the last six years that it has remained flat, resulting in no tax increase in the local portion of the residential tax rate. This preliminary tax rate does not apply to either the school or county portion of your property tax. The school tax will increase this year as voters passed a budget which calls for an increase of \$104.78 per average household.

Mayor Gallagher credited con-trolled spending as one of the main reasons the rate will remain stable. Through attrition and staff changes the borough saved \$230,000 in employee salaries and by revamping their insurance they will see an estimated cost savings of \$260,000. Changing health insurance carriers and prescription plans were two reasons for the savings. CFO Glenn Cullen said that no one lost any benefits as a result of these changes.

Also helping was the fact that South Plainfield's collection on property taxes is 99.79 percent.

Cullen added that the refinancing of borough debt at a lower interest rate was another reason the borough was able to save money. Standard and Poors recently raised the bond rating on South Plainfield from A+ to AA-. The borough recently refinanced approximately 50 percent of their debt at an estimated savings of \$480,000 over five years. This is the first time in 23 years that the borough's rate has

been adjusted.

Despite the "belt tightening," the borough was able to purchase a fire truck and an ambulance.

# Four Teachers Announce Retirement

Susan D. Goldey, Linda Rocca, Ann Schenck and Mary Ann Stavina have announced their plans to retire form the South Plainfield School System this year. They will have served the children of South Plainfield for a total of 117 years

Susan D. Goldey earned a BA degree from Douglass College, an Ed. M from Rutgers University and has done work at Kean College, Trenton State and St. Peter's College in Jersey City. She is certified to teach Spanish, English as a Second Language and General Science and holds a Supervisor's Certificate. She has been an educator for 35 years, taught Spanish and ESL in South Plainfield since 1972 at both the Middle and High Schools and is one of the few teachers remaining on the staff who taught split sessions in the old high school (the current Middle School).

As a team leader for more than 15 years, Goldey has had an abiding interest in curriculum. Most recently she has been instrumental in convincing the Board of Education of the neces sity of having a serious elementary foreign language program, an exploratory language experience in the sixth grade, and a choice of Spanish and French in the seventh and eighth grades. The programs will begin this September. Last year she also brought the concept of teaching Heritage Spanish to South Plainfield. South Plainfield High School now has two classes of Hispanic students who are studying their heritage while honing their lan-guage skills. Previously these students vere undervalued by placing them in classes which did not recognize the value of their backgrounds.

Goldey is a member of the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese as well as Foreign Language Educators of NAJ (FLENJ). She attended World Language Supervisors' meetings to keep abreast of state mandates. She has endeavored to train the teachers in the World Language Department about the "new standards" and the use of authentic assessment tools.

As the sponsor of the Sociedad Honoraria Hispanica (Spanish Honor Society) for more than a decade, she is proud that two students from South Plainfield have won national scholarships and recognition from the organization. She also co-chaired the last Middle States Evaluation and was partially responsible, with Ms. Zajkowski and Mrs. Brown, for using the "Accreditation for Growth" paradigm to replace the outdated model which had been used for the previous half century. She received a commendation from the Board of Education for co-conducting the Middle States evaluation.

Goldey is an active member of her education associations, which include nine years as the South Plainfield delegate to the NEA Representative Assembly, 25 years as a representative to the Middlesex County Education As-

sociation, active participation in SPEA (from 1976 to 2000), and NJEA.

Maryann Stavina has taught in South Plainfield for 33 years and has been an educator for 38. She graduated from Youngstown State University with an undergraduate degree in Elementary Education/English. She has earned additional graduate credits in Education from YSU and New Jersey City University. She taught at "old, old" Grant School from 1970-1975, at Grant from 1975-1980 and at Franklin from 1980-present. Although she has taught third and fourth grades, she is currently teaching all grades as a "floater" or permanent substitute. Stavina is a member of NEA, NJEA, and SPEA, and served as a building representative for the later organization. She has also worked on curriculum development committees. In her spare time she enjoys reading, gardening and traveling.

Linda Rocca is currently a Resource Center teacher at Franklin School but has also taught third grade. She has been an educator for 24 years, 19 of them in South Plainfield. Rocca gradu-

ated from South Plainfield High School in 1964 and received her undergraduate degree in Early Childhood and Elementary Education from Newark State (Kean University). She earned graduate credits for Teacher of the Handicapped and Dyslexia Specialist from Kean and Fairleigh Dickinson Universities. She is a member of NEA, NIEA, SPEA and International Dyslexia Association (IDA). As a member of the Orton Dyslexia Society. New Jersey Branch, she served on the Board of Directors and as the Chair of the Publicity Committee. Rocca also participates in outreach programs as an advocate for multisensory based reading programs. At school she has volunteered her time for Regular and Special Education Committees and as a member of PAC (Pupil Assistance Committee). In 1996-1997 she received the Governor's Teacher Recognition Program Award as an outstanding teacher representing Franklin School. She was also awarded a schol-arship to the Scottish Rite Masonic Learning Center Teacher Training Program. Her husband Ed taught in South Plainfield for 34 years and retired seven years ago. Now Rocca is looking forward to traveling, swimming in the Gulf of Mexico and snowmobiling in Pennsylvania.

Ann Schenck, who plans to retire at the beginning of July, has been a part of the Educational Support team in the South Plainfield school system for 30 years. She has been the secretary to the Principal at Grant Central Sixth for the past three years. Her previous assignments have included Secretary to the Director of Federal Projects, Secretary to the Assistant Superintendent at the Administration Building and Secretary to the Principal at Riley School. Schenck is a member of NJEA and SPEA and served as a PTA officer and Music Booster representative. She enjoys spending time with her four grandchildren and her Maltese dog. Her hobbies include reading, traveling, collecting Longaberger baskets and pottery.










# Congratulations South Plainfield High School



# Roosevelt School Looses **Power After Truck Hits Wire**

On June 18, at about 10:15 am., a tractor-trailer owned by Old Dominion Trucking of Springfield, IL and operated by Richard Governale, age 52, of Edison, was making a delivery at Roosevelt Elementary School when the truck struck a cable guide wire as it entered a parking lot, snapping the telephone pole. This caused a power outages within several areas of the school. Within 20 minutes of the incident, PSE&G responded and power to the school and surrounding area of Tackson Ave. was shut off while repairs were made. There were also sporadic reports of phone service interruptions in the area

All the children, grades K through fifth grade, were escorted to the gymnasium, and were eventually dismissed at 1 p.m. without incident. The students were already scheduled for early dismissal as part of the yearend calendar. There were no injuries

Members of the South Plainfield

Police and Fire departments responded, along with personnel from the South Plainfield Rescue Squad and the Office of Emergency Management.

A vehicle owned by Mary Spisso of South Plainfield was damaged when an insulator for the power lines fell on her car while parked on Jackson Ave. near Evona Ave. Spisso is employed as a school crossing guard at that location.

# Varsity Golf Season Review

What I always found interesting about golf is that you shoot a tiny ball into an expansive fairway (at least hopefully instead of the rough or worse, the path of another hole) only to have to sink it into a tiny cup four inches in diameter. It is one of the world's most popular sports for several reasons, two being that it is a lifetime sport and that just about anyone can play it. The flip side to that coin is that it is also one of the most challenging and skill-oriented. Golf is a sport that can provide enjoyment just as easily as anxiety. If you think I'm exaggerating, go out on a course and find out for yourself.

A common argument is that golf is not a sport, because there is little physical activity involved. The dictionary definition of the word sport by itself refutes this argument. The accuracy, mental focus, variety of skills, precise physical movements, and constant, integral decisions to make re-quired by the player are all undeniable elements of a sport. As for the physical fitness aspect, I won't argue that you need to be in outstanding shape, but players in competition are required to walk the full 9 or 18 holes (roughly two to four miles), which is

Moving past my using this column as an opportunity to vent indignation, the South Plainfield High School Varsity Golf team posted another impressive season this year. Improving on last ear's 17-5 record, the boys went 19-3-1 to win the White Division.

The truly impressive thing about the golf program at SPHS is that Head Coach Mike Kavka considered this to be only an average season. There were a lot of good things to say about this

season, especially the White Division Championship; Kavka did not consider it to be a disappointment by any means, just not a great one. While he was fairly satisfied with the team's eighth place finish in the state tournament, he thought the GMC Tournament results were a disappointment, because South Plainfield, South Brunswick, East Brunswick, and St. Joe's are considered the top four who often duke it out for the top spot, and the Tigers placed a still respectable seventh overall.

In his 21 years, Kavka has always had high expectations for his golfers. "You set out to win each match as they come along," said Kavka, adding that you have to be prepared each time you set foot on the tee. "It (golf) is the sport that is the most fun to play. If it came too easy, we would tire of it and not play it," Kavka also said.

When asked why SPHS has always been a consistently strong golf team, Kavka said, "There's a lot of interest," adding, "If you want to play, you've got to be better than the next guy.

Last week, I wrote that high school tennis teams are inherently small; the same applies to golf teams. There are only six Varsity positions per match open, but all of Kavka's 12 golfers got to play at least five rounds. Junior Danny DeAndrea was this year's MVP and led the team with the lowest average (40 strokes for nine holes). Senior Frank Gaspari averaged 41; juniors Mike Alvarez, Guy Severini, and Billy Weaver all averaged 42; sopho-mores Billy Padula, who was Rookie of the Year, and Pete DeAndrea averaged 43; and sophomore Brian Murtagh averaged a 44. Senior Mike Jankoski, a regular Varsity golfer for the last three years, suffered an injury this season. DeAndrea and Gaspari

News Tribune while Severini was a Third Team pick and Padula received an Honorable Mention.

The Tigers practice at West Nine Golf Course five days a week. Before matches start, they have a month of preparation to regain any skills they may have lost over the seasons since it is almost impossible to play golf not only in the winter season, but also if you play other sports in other seasons. They play full rounds (in practice), but working on skills is paramount to the overall score, which is the main focus of competitions instead. The Tigers focus on driving, getting the drive to the green in as few shots as possible, chipping, and putting, all while being as accurate as possible and being sure to correct errant shots while avoiding compounding mistakes and maintain-

ing composure.

"It's always personally rewarding to see (young) people improve their skills and enjoy the game," said Kavka, an avid golfer himself. "Golf is something that you look forward to playing, and when you have a good round or you make a good shot, there's the personal satisfaction that you get from preparing yourself to do that.



Arrange blueberries evenly over middle of topping. Fill easy accent decorator with whipped cream. Pipe rosette around edge of pie. Place strawberry halves on whip topping border.
