Mark Tomei Named *Star-Ledger* Player of the Week

South Plainfield High School junior, Mark Tomei was named the *Star-Ledger* Player of the Week for week eight in varsity baseball. Mark plays outfield for the Tigers and is their lead-off batter. He is batting an even .500, and at 96 at bats Mark has 48 hits which include 17 doubles, four triples and seven runs batted in (RBI).

Since that date, Mark has greatly assisted the Tigers during the Greater

Middlesex Conference (GMC) tournament games. In the quarter-finals Tomei singled, doubled, tripled and scored three runs. Additionally, in the semi-final game against Perth Amboy, Mark hit a three-run home run, and along with his teammates advanced to the final game of that tournament against Old Bridge.

Mark's dream is to one day be a professional baseball player.

Tigers Defeat Perth Amboy 11-5; Advance to GMC Championship Final

Lately 11 would appear to be the lucky number for the South Plainfield Tigers. During the Greater Middlesex Conference (GMC) tournament on May 23, the Tigers beat Woodbridge 11-1 in the quarterfinals, and on Saturday in the semifinals they took down top-seeded Perth Amboy, 11-5. They'll take it-all the way to the championship game where they'll face second-seeded Old Bridge at a game to be played at East Brunswick High School on June 1 (after presstime).

In Saturday's semifinals, South Plainfield took to the field in the second game of the evening. The Tigers scored seven runs in the sixth inning, taking and holding on to the lead. Home run hitters were Mark Tomei (three run homer), Quinn Cochrane (solo) and Dan Hansen (two home runs), who finished the game with an impressive six runs batted in. The team advances to the finals in the GMC tournament with a 21-7 season record.

The comments in last week's paper by the heads of the teachers' union really missed the mark.

In my opinion, the council acted quite responsibly when it reduced the tax increase proposed by the school board. Voters said "no" to the school budget, and regardless of the margin, nearly a thousand people cast their vote for lower school spending. It would have been wrong for the council to ignore these voters.

But recognizing that the school board had already cut back its staffing, the council went in with a scalpel

rather than a machete. In doing so, it came up with reductions to surplus accounts and reserves, which will not affect a single program or cut a single job. In fact, the school board president and the superintendent signed a letter guaranteeing that the council's reductions would not require any layoffs beyond those the board was already planning.

In my mind, the union should be happy that the council worked so hard to try to protect teaching spots, while at the same time, doing what the public said it had to do. One union official described the council as being "cavalier." It was anything but. If it had been, the council members would not have required a jobs guarantee as part of its agreement with the school board.

I realize that the extremes on both sides will never be happy in a situation like this. Some people wanted the budget cut to the bone, and some wanted no cuts whatsoever. The result is in between, a middle ground. In the end, the council was faced with a tough job, and it acted commendably by working together with the board to do what was right for the majority of people in our town. Again, in my opinion, the council acted responsibly.

Borough Seeks Sustainable Jersey Certification

In 2009, the Borough of South Plainfield passed a resolution to register in the Sustainable Jersey Municipal Government Certification Program. This provides a framework and incentives for municipalities working to become sustainable communities—communities that embody a good quality of life while minimizing impact on environment and other resources, now and for future generations.

The next step was taken by the South Plainfield Environmental Commission in January 2011. The commission amended its by-laws to form a Green Team as mandated by the certification program. Eight members were chosen: four from the Environ-

mental Commission (Dorothy Miele, Robyn Rusnak, Christopher Cioffi, Jonathan Walezak), Dr. Alice Tempel (South Plainfield Environmental Specialist), Robert Capparelli (head of the Department of Public Works), Glenn Cullen (Chief Financial Officer) and Christine Buteas (Environmental Commission Council Liaison).

The final step was taken by the governing body of South Plainfield when it approved a resolution on February 22 formally establishing the Green Team to identify, prioritize, select and enable sustainability initiatives that will benefit the residents and business people of South Plainfield by raising community awareness; engaging citizen volunteerism; maintaining fiscal responsibility; and attaining Sustainable Jersey certification.

A sustainable community seeks to optimize quality of life for its residents by ensuring that its environmental, economic and social objectives are balanced and mutually supportive. It strives to save tax dollars, assure clean land, air and water and improve working and living environments as steps to building a sustainable community that will thrive well into the next cen-



ture. Municipalities which attain Sustainable Jersey certification gain access to grants and program funding.

The Green Team will seek citizen participation as it moves forward with initiatives and programs designed to identify and implement best practices in the ways of natural resource protection, waste reduction, energy efficiency and in many other areas.

Sustainable Jersey is a partnership between the New Jersey League of Municipalities, Mayors Committee for a Green Future, New Jersey Sustainable State Institute at Rutgers University, Municipal Land Use Center at The College of New Jersey, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Rutgers Center for Green Building, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and a coalition of New Jersey nonprofits, state agencies and experts in various fields.

The Green Team meets from 7-8 p.m. the second Wednesday of the month in the conference room at Borough Hall, 2480 Plainfield Ave. The public is invited to attend.

Greetings from the library. Why pay for movie rentals? Come to the library where renting movies is free! We have a great selection from hot new releases to television shows to classics. Some recent new movies that we own are *The Mechanic*, *I Am Number Four*, *The Other Woman*, *Blue Valentine*, *No Strings Attached*, *Justin Bieber: Never Say Never*, *The Roommate*, *Gnomeo and Juliet*, *Waiting for Forever*, *The Green Hornet*, *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows Part 1* and *The Kings Speech*.

For all those who love to listen to audio books in their car or on their iPod or MP3 player or read e-books on their new e-reader, we are a part of *ListenNJ*. *ListenNJ* provides free access to two kinds of downloadable books. Audio books, such as MP3 and wav files, are recordings to listen to. Some downloads are available for iPods and Macintosh computers (when you access the title, it will indicate if it is iPod compatible). E-books are digital books that are read on either a computer screen or on a portable reader. Library patrons should connect via the link "Free Audio book downloads" on our home page, www.southplainfield.lib.nj.us. Then choose the *ListenNJ* link you want, either go to the home page or go directly to their e-book collection. You then log in with your valid library card to download desired titles. Please note that your account must be in good standing for this service to work. The *ListenNJ* website provides help and a list of compatible devices.

We also have MP3 books on CD that patrons can borrow. The MP3 disc contains the entire book on one or two CDs as opposed to a regular book on CD which can contain seven or more CDs. These discs can be played

in compatible cars, CD and DVD players, computers and can be transferred to your MP3 player or iPod as well. Most new cars since 2006 are equipped with players that are MP3 compatible, so come in and check one out and see if it works for you. We have numerous bestsellers available in this format.

For those interested in learning a foreign language, we have recently purchased a new database: BYKI (Before You Know It) which has over 80 different languages to choose from as well as ESL for non-English speakers. You can sign up through the library's website. You will have to create your own personal username. There is a tutorial video that will provide help in how to use this resource. One of the cool features is that you can actually hear how the word or phrase is supposed to be pronounced, which makes learning it easier. There is also a BYKI app for cell phones and other portable devices so you can use BYKI on the go!

The library now has a Facebook page where we post information about upcoming events and special programs. You can find it at www.facebook.com/southplainfieldlibrary.

We will be following the regular schedule for children's programs. The Storytime program for age two and three is held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings at 10:30. Storytime for ages four and up is held Wednesday evening at 6:30 and Thursday afternoon at 1:15. The Babytime program for ages up to two years old is held Friday morning at 10:30. These programs do not require registration. Please try to get to the storytime programs on time because it can get very disruptive for Miss Linda and Miss Mija and the children if people come in the middle of the program.
