

Roof Repairs Contracts

By Jane Dornick

The Board of Education awarded contracts for school building re-roof designs totalling nearly \$1.8M at the June 13 public meeting.

ARMM Associates of Cherry Hill, a commercial roof consulting firm, was hired by the board on April 18 as the architect to perform preliminary specification work at a cost of \$112,150. Out of nine bidders, E.R. Barrett, Inc. of Newark was the lowest bidder (\$939,310) for repairs to the roof at the high school.

Ten bids were received for work at the middle school. The two lowest bidders were ARCH Concept Construction of North Haledon (\$752,000) and E.R. Barrett, Inc. \$766,250). The numerically low bid from ARCH was rejected as

tics. "I think this is going to be an exciting November. My family has lived in South Plainfield for almost 35 years. I want to see our community grow stronger," he said.

Melanson attended St. Joseph High School and graduated in 2005. He then attended Rutgers University earning a degree in criminal justice. Melanson is currently employed by Target in South Plainfield as a reverse logistics team member.

Magnani graduated from South Plainfield High School in 1998. He briefly attended Middlesex County College and is currently employed by Total Sono, LLC, a family courier business. Prior to that, Magnani was a loan officer for Secure Lending Solutions in Glen Rock, Prospect Mortgage in Linden and Indymac Bank FSB, also in Linden. His brother, Peter, is a police officer in the borough.



Born and raised in Newark, brothers Rich and S. Carl Adlassnig took their small local automobile mechanical shop, that was outgrowing its location, to South Plainfield in 1962. When they purchased the shop, Rich and Carl moved their families to the borough and purchased the property at 3330 Park Ave. They began performing auto body repair under the name R&C Auto Body and started out with six employees.

The building in the early 1900s originally housed a horse and buggy repair shop. When the automobile became the new mode of transportation, the structure was eventually updated by its previous owners to accommodate an automobile mechanical shop.

In 1965, Rich and Carl suffered a major loss when a work related accident caused a fire that gutted the building, injuring four firemen and one employee. The fire did not stop the brother's determination to reopen the shop.

During the 1970s, the Adlassnig's became very active in community activities by sponsoring the Pop Warner football team and a golf team that played at the West Nine Golf Course. They had also been members of the Rotary Club for over 25 years and now belong to the South Plainfield Business

In the 1980s, the men would use the facility to build floats for Pop Warner to participate in the annual Labor Day parade. Rich and Carl also had a passion for building race cars during the same time period. They built the Fireball Monza funny car and 1940 Chevy Coupe dragster which they raced up and down the East Coast and in Canada. The Monza won several races in Englishtown.

R&C Auto Body also assisted the high school by running a cooperative education program in the 1970s and 1980s. Students would spend half a day at school and the other half learning a trade at the shop. "We broke in over 50 kids," said Rich, who recalled working with children who were troubled and needed to learn a trade.

Rich and wife Karen have a daughter, Jennifer, who lives in Nashville, Tenn.; S. Carl and wife Dianne have a son, Carl, and two daughters, Sharon Ferraro, from South Plainfield, and Kim Cherichello, who resides in Texas.

In 1994, after graduating from Rutgers University with a B.A. in business management, son Carl joined the business. He worked hands-on in the shop until he was eventually promoted to manager. "We treat every car as if it were our own and every customer how you would want any of your family members to be treated. R&C Auto Body's objective is to fix it right the first time," said Carl.

Carl and wife Michele continue the legacy of remaining active within the community. Both are members of Sacred Heart Church and daughters, Sarah and Kaitlyn, attend Holy Savior Academy. Carl and his family volunteer their time at Holy Savior Academy's 5K Run and for the American Cancer Society. He is also a member of the Knights of Columbus and Michele is co-president of the Holy Savior Acad-

April Bengivenga Named Delegate To Republican National Convention

April Bengivenga, chair of the South as a delegate to a national nominating Plainfield Republicans, will be heading to Tampa Bay, Fla. in August, where she will be a delegate to the Republican National Convention.

Bengivenga was on the ballot during the June 6 primary and elected to serve as one of two delegates to represent New Jersey's Sixth Congressional District for presidential candidate Mitt Romney, former governor of Massachusetts. The Sixth Congressional District encompasses nearly 50 municipalities and has population of over 600,000 people. Delegates to the convention come from all 50 states, the District of Columbia and five U.S. territories, and at the convention they choose their party's candidates for president and vice president.

This is a huge honor for South Plainfield," said Mayor Matt Anesh. "I don't know that anyone from our town has ever been elected to serve convention before, and I know nobody has in recent memory."

Bengivenga will be one of 2,286 delegates, but she won't be the only one from South Plainfield. Joining her as honorary delegates will be GOP Vice Chair Stephanie Bartfalvi, former Chairman Bob Jones and Councilman Rob Bengivenga.

The convention runs from August 27-30 and is expected to draw over 15,000 credentialed media from around the world. Delegates travel to the convention at their own expense and devote considerable time to attending convention floor sessions. The highlight is the nominating session, where the delegates cast votes for the Republican nominee to be president and vice president. The vote is the culmination of a primary process that began back at the beginning of the year.

Kake Queen Francis Ruiz "Bakes Magic" in South Plainfield

Francis Ruiz is the quintessential "cake queen" of South Plainfield. Always the first to make special cakes or cupcakes for her daughters' classmates at Riley School, Ruiz would bring the intricately-themed treats to school for holiday and birthday parties. When a Riley teacher was getting ready to go on maternity leave, Ruiz baked cupcakes for the mother-to-be.

Soon, teachers at Riley would send notes home with her children, Kaylah, now 13, and Jaydah, now 11, asking if she could bake them cakes for special occasions. But it wasn't until Ruiz's husband lost his job as a computer technician in New York City when he suggested she start her own business selling cakes to supplement the family income. Ruiz didn't think she was good enough, nor had she entertained the idea before.

"Everyone at Riley School was my guinea pig," she laughed. "I don't think they even knew it, but I was practicing on them!"

The more she baked, the better she got, and the more confident she became. Always her biggest supporter, Ruiz's husband pushes her even when she thinks she can't possibly create a cake as requested by a customer.

"No one taught me how to do this. Most of what I learned was from watching the Food Network Channel," Ruiz said.

Now known as Kake Queen LLC, Ruiz is booked weeks in advance, baking the cakes at her Newark church and decorating them in her South

Plainfield home. She has created every kind of cake imaginable, from novelty cakes, to her very first wedding cake in June (above), to one of the more challenging projects she has undertaken: a cake in the shape of a slot machine.

It was Pat Hajduk, a secretary at Riley School in 2011, who asked Ruiz if she could make a cake for her brother-in-law, Mike, who was throwing a surprise 50th birthday party for his wife, Kathy, in February of 2011. As part of the surprise, Mike was going to take Kathy on a trip to Las Vegas, so he asked Ruiz if she could create a "Wheel of Fortune" slot machine

"I didn't know what he was talking about! I never gamble! So, I spent time talking to him on the phone and in person, and sketched out what he wanted. It was so intricate and detailed, it was crazy to make a cake like that!" Ruiz recalled.

Last year, Ruiz was chosen to be a volunteer baker for Icing Smiles, "a non-profit organization that provides custom celebration cakes and other treats to families impacted by the critical illness of a child." Her first project, a beautiful purple birthday cake for a 13 year-old cancer patient, was featured in the Observer in

In March, Ruiz competed in a bake-off at the Garden State Cake Club in Mt. Laurel at the urging of many of her Facebook fans. Her entry was a cake in the shape of a sneaker, and although she did not win, she was chosen to compete against another contestant in a live cake challenge. It was her dream come true when she was paired up with Norman Davis and Zane Beg from the Food Network Channel and given two hours to decorate a three-tier wedding cake. She won the challenge and received a goodie bag of cake decorating tools that she has since put to good use.

Ruiz is quick to donate to many charities in town as well as her hometown of Newark. She donates cakes to a school for autistic children in Newark as well as to the pediatric Christmas party at St. Michael's Peter Ho Clinic.

A 1995 graduate of the former Jersey City University with a B.A. in sociology, Ruiz worked for 10 years at St. Michael's as a social worker for children and adults living with HIV/AIDS.

Her deep compassion for those less fortunate stems from personal tragedy in her own life. One of six children born to hardworking parents in Newark, Ruiz's brother, Jose Melo, ended up living on the streets in Newark. Not the stereotypical homeless person, Melo holds a master's degree in Spanish Literature from Rutgers, but had dropped out of society due to mental illness.

"I was able to keep track of him while I was working in Newark, but now I've lost touch with him and we don't know where he is," said Ruiz, tears in her eyes. She has not seen nor heard from her brother in at least five years. "Maybe someone somewhere will read this and get me back in touch with my brother."

Ruiz, who also has a five year-old daughter, Laylah, dreams of opening her own storefront bake shop in South Plainfield. She also has plans to sponsor a scholarship at the high school for a student interested in pursuing the culinary arts next year.

And, she continues to "bake magic" that brings smiles to the faces of so many of her loyal customers and friends on Facebook.

In an effort to promote "innovation, reform and excellence in America's public schools," President Barack Obama created the Race to the Top monetary incentive for states. The Board of Education accepted its portion at the June 13 Regular Public Meeting in the amount of \$24,827.

Backed by a historic \$4.35B investment, the reforms contained in Race to the Top is intended to help prepare America's students to graduate ready for college and career, and enable them to out-compete any worker, anywhere in the world.

KC's Korner Wins Glitter Award

Asked if he has a problem with litter, Kurilew responded that the staff is very careful about keeping the outside dining area clean so that litter does not escape to the street; however, he noted that the worst litter problem he has is cigarette butts. Many people do not use the butt bucket provided in the parking lot, preferring to drop their butts on the ground.

Membership in the CBA is open to all businesses that share its goal of enhancing the appearance of commercial districts through property maintenance and litter control


Sign-up for the reading programs began June 25; however, children and young adults cannot begin redeeming prizes until July 2.


Formerly of Bridgewater, Phillip was born in Wales, Great Britain arriving in the United States at the age of 10.







materially defective because they were not properly qualified by the New Jersey Schools Development Authority as required by the bid documents and specifications. E.R. Barrett was fully responsive to all material conditions of the bid documents and specifications and had the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

Initially, ARMM estimated the total cost of repairs at both schools to be approximately \$2M; however, a third contract was awarded to perform minor roof repairs at the rest of the schools and the administration building. Two bids were received from E.R. Barrett and Pravco, Inc. of Rahway. Pravco was awarded the bid at \$91,700, which was almost \$37,000 less than E.R. Barrett.

According to board member Carol Byrne, chair of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, in April of this year, 30,000 sq. ft. of roof and insulation of the high school-including the main two-story part of the building and the shop hallway-were slated to be replaced. The bid work specifica-tions now show that only 2,000 square feet of existing roof composite and 5,000 square feet of existing wet roof composite will be removed on the 155,620 sq. ft. building. An infrared scan from last year showed that 3,272 sq. ft. of the insulation was wet. At the middle school, the gym

roof was to be replaced along with installation of new windows and interior repairs. According to the work specifications, 12,000 square feet of existing roof composite and 1,000 square feet of existing wet roof composite will be replaced, far more than initially estimated. As per the architectural drawings ARMM used for the bid specs, half of the building's roof where the gym is located will receive a second layer. The windows will be caulked in lieu of replacement.

The total cost of the repairs is unknown because the bids were awarded on a "base cost." Estímates were also given by bidders as to the necessity of adding or deducting material costs once the re-roof and repairs begin. If further dampness is found in the roofs' insulation through supplemental infrared scans, there may be a substantial increase in the cost of materials and labor.

The Thermoplastic PolyOlefin (TPO) roof system membrane that will be used in the re-roofing areas has a manufacturer's 20-year, no dollar limit warranty. The isocyanurate-a rigid foam-hardboard insulation also carries the same warranty.

Repairs began last week and should be completed prior to the opening of schools on Wednesday, Sept. 5. Funding for the project will come from the capital outlay and reserve accounts.




